Texas was administered as a Foreign Mission from 1838 to 1845, being visited by Bishop Polk of Louisiana and Bishop Freeman of Arkansas. When Texas became a state of the union in 1845, it continued under the care of Bishop Freeman.

The Diocese of Texas was organized in 1849 and continued under Bishop Freeman's care until Bishop Gregg was consecrated. The original diocese, comprising the whole state, was divided in 1874. Since that time, the Diocese of Texas has been made up of the 57 counties of southeast and east Texas, viz: that portion of the State of Texas lying south of the northern line of the counties of Lampasas, Coryell, McLennan, Limestone, Freestone, Anderson, Smith, Gregg, and Marion, and east of the western line of the counties of Matagorda, Colorado, Fayette, Bastrop, Travis, Burnet, and Lampasas.

THE 166th COUNCIL

February 6, 2015 HOLY EUCHARIST

The 166th Annual Council of the Diocese of Texas opened on Friday evening, February 6, 2015, at seven o'clock with a celebration of the Holy Eucharist in the Woodlands Waterway Marriott Convention Center, The Woodlands, Texas. The Right Reverend C. Andrew Doyle, Bishop of Texas, was the celebrant of the liturgy. The preacher for the liturgy was The Right Reverend Jeff Fisher, Bishop Suffragan of the Diocese of Texas. Assisting Bishop Doyle in the Holy Eucharist were Bishop Harrison and Bishop Fisher. Also assisting were the Reverend Russell Oechsel, Archdeacon and the Reverend Victoria Anne Mason, Deacon. The Bishops were assisted in the administration of the Holy Communion by the diocesan canons and diocesan clergy.

Saturday, February 7, 2015 BUSINESS SESSION

At 8:30 Saturday morning, in the Convention Center of the Woodlands Waterway Marriott, The Woodlands, Texas, the 166th Annual Council of the Episcopal Diocese of Texas was called to order by the Bishop, The Right Reverend C. Andrew Doyle. After placing a copy of the Bible on the rostrum in view of the Delegates and opened to the Gospel of Mark, the Bishop read Mark 4:26-34. The Bishop then announced that the Reverend Elizabeth Holden had been appointed as chaplain to the 166th Council. The Chaplain led the Council in a prayer for the 166th Council following which there was a period of "Sharing Faith" table stories. The Bishop announced that each table had "Bible Study cards" and asked the delegates to turn around to the table behind them and take turns in reading and answering the card questions.

Bishop Doyle announced that, there would be opportunity to hold Sharing of Faith dinners throughout the Diocese.

The Secretary announced that as of 8:25, 232 clergy and 459 lay delegates had registered. In order to establish a quorum, the Secretary first asked one lay delegate from each congregation to stand. All the clergy were asked to stand. The Secretary then certified that a quorum was present.

Beginning the report concerning Credentials, the Secretary announced that there were no congregations in arrears on their Diocesan Assessment. The Secretary then announced that there were no congregations in arrears to the Church Pension Fund.

Continuing the Credentials Report, the Secretary then moved that all licensed clergy who function as heads of congregations and those who are licensed to serve as assisting clergy

or on the staff of diocesan congregations be admitted to Council with seat and voice but without vote. The motion was seconded. There being no objection the Bishop declared the motion adopted.

The Secretary announced that two Parochial Reports had not been submitted by the time of the opening of Council. As neither congregation was represented in Council, the Bishop announced that should they show up the Council would welcome them.

Bishop Doyle appointed the following College delegates to the 166th Council: Baylor University, Alistair Jones (D); Rice University, Emily Statham (D); University of Texas (Austin), Lindsey Limbaugh (D), Parkes Ousley (A); and Texas A&M, Travis Garcia (D), Samantha Cox (A).

The Bishop appointed and welcomed to Council the following Youth delegates from the following ten Convocations to have seat and voice but without vote: Austin, Oliver Chapin-Eiserloh (St. David's, Austin); Central, Elise Ford (St. John's, Sealy); East Harris, Nettie Bryant (Trinity Baytown); Galveston, Megan Pennington (Trinity, Galveston); Northeast, Alyson Riley (St. Cyprian's, Lufkin); Northwest, Rebecca Davis (St. Christopher's, Killeen); Southeast, Madelyn Holle (St. Stephen's, Beaumont); San Jacinto, Ursula Carr (Trinity, The Woodlands); Southwest, Peyton Hoover (St. Catherine of Sienna, Missouri City); and West Harris, Olive Onyekwelu (Epiphany, Houston).

The Bishop announced that the 166th Council was now organized for business. The Bishop announced that he had appointed Dennis Clark as Parliamentarian for the 166th Council and that David Harvin was present as Chancellor of the Diocese.

The chair of the Committee on Dispatch of Business presented the Special Rules of Procedure as printed in the Order of Business booklet and moved their adoption. There being no discussion, by a two-thirds standing vote the motion was ruled adopted. The committee chair then moved the adoption of the Council's Order of Business as also printed in the Order of Business booklet. The motion was adopted on a voice vote.

The Bishop announced that there was no unfinished business from the 165th Council and certified that the minutes of the 165th Council as published in Volume II of the Journal of the 165th Council to be a true and accurate record of the proceedings of that Council. The Bishop attested to the validity of the minutes of the 165th Council.

The Bishop announced that there were no vacancies to fill for Regular Council Committees: Canon MacGregor, chair of the Committee on New Parishes and Missions, made the following report.

Right Reverend Sir, clergy and delegates, on behalf of the Committee on Missions and Parishes, I want to report on the congregational development work completed in 2014, some plans that are underway for 2015, and the official formation of a new fellowship established in our diocese.

Our bishop is fond of saying, "God has a mission, and that mission has a church." Our church, The Episcopal Diocese of Texas, shares in God's mission as we proclaim to be One Church, reconciled by Jesus Christ, Empowered by the Holy Spirit, called by God through worship, witness and ministry, building the Kingdom of God together.

Your diocesan congregational development team includes Bishop Doyle, bishops Harrison and Fisher, Canon Ryan, Bob Biehl our treasurer, David Fisher, the director of foundations, Bob Schorr Manager of Church Plants and Strategic Development, and myself along with our administrative assistants Julie Heath and Dania Lainez. We work together on specific tasks. But our work is only part of a larger effort of a talented diocesan staff whose sole purpose is to support you, our 153 congregations, so that together, as One Church we can work to fulfill God's mission in our part of Texas. From Christian formation to communications to finance, and administrative support, our diocesan staff is here to serve you.

Our ministry is to listen and respond, assist and resource, coach and network, advise and train. It is also our privilege to provide you with workshops, seminars, classes and conferences to inspire and teach.

Many of you in this room have interacted with us and participated in our offerings. We thank you for the opportunity to work with you. For it is so much more rewarding when we do this holy work together, work that deserves all of our best efforts.

At this time I want to account for a portion of the 2014 congregational development work generated by my division. Collectively, Bob Schorr and I had 237 meetings with clergy, vestries, search committees, and individual lay leaders either personally, on location at churches, through conference or other scheduled phone appointments, at Camp Allen or in our offices. These meetings represented work with 61 of our congregations and often meant returning multiple times to the same churches.

We also worked closely with or were responsible for the oversight of specialized groups of clergy including Church Planters, the Commission on Hispanic Ministry, Curate Camp, the Greenfield Commission, Redevelopers, the, bi-vocational clericus, and First Time in Charge. I would like to highlight our office's work with the Commission on Hispanic Ministry. The clergy who serve our Hispanic communities are working together in new and collaborative ways, partnering to strengthen their distinctive ministries. We are pleased that two of our congregations, St. Alban's/San Alban and St. Paul's/San Pablo, both in Houston, will be sharing their clergy, The Rev. Bill Laucher and the Rev. Oscar Huerta Garcia, in order to serve these two churches that have services in both English and Spanish. This work begins this month and is a first of its kind for our diocese.

I am also pleased to report that the Hispanic Commission held their second successful Lay Hispanic Conference last June with a record attendance of over 150 people. They are looking forward to breaking that record this June 12-13 when they will hold the 2015 Lay Hispanic Conference again at Camp Allen.

Our congregational development office also offered an Evangelism workshop for Northwest Houston, a Second Campus Workshop in Austin, and THE Conference in May at Camp Allen. Wardens and Vestry Conferences took a hiatus in 2014 but have returned in a compressed format as Vestry Basics 101: An orientation for new and nearly new vestry and bishop's committee members. We just held our Houston area

Vestry Basics 101 Conference last weekend at Calvary, Richmond, and will hold our final two Vestry Basics 101 next Saturday, Feb. 14, for the Austin and Waco areas at Grace Episcopal Church, Georgetown and on March 21 in the northeast convocation location to be announced. I will mention in a few moments some more of the conference offerings we will sponsor in 2015.

Our office also oversees our diocesan lona School for Ministry which continues to be an outstanding educational resource for the formation of priests and deacons. The school celebrated its 10th anniversary last year under the outstanding academic leadership of The Rev. Sam Todd. 34 priests, 29 deacons and 2 lay professionals from our diocese have graduated since its inception in 2004 not counting those who have come from 4 other dioceses to attend our program. A few years ago The Iona School spawned a national formation program called the lona Initiative which now falls under the auspices of the Seminary of the Southwest. Fourteen dioceses from across the country are starting up internal formation programs that are modeled on our own, and there are over 60 students involved in those programs from Hawaii to Alabama. We can be proud of the work of our own school and the new collaboration with the seminary to support and launch the Iona Initiative. The Iona School recently had a strategic planning retreat which laid the foundation for its future which includes a significant lay ministry formation track to begin in the fall of 2016. Clergy of the diocese, we encourage you to look around your congregations to see who might have a calling to bi-vocational ministry and begin conversations with them. The need for more clergy and deploying them for ministry in a variety of venues continues to grow.

And now let's talk about the work of evangelism. I want to repeat a challenge I have given you for the past two years. And that challenge is, where is God calling your congregation to have fresh expressions of evangelism and in what ways? How are you empowering and resourcing your people to share the Good News of Christ Jesus? How are you thinking creatively? What risks for the sake of the Gospel are you taking? And now I want to add one more challenge and that is, have you begun thinking and praying about what kind of missional community will be born out of your congregation? You may be asking, what is a missional community? Well wait for Bishop Doyle's address and you will hear more.

We have been hard at work to support your congregation in its evangelism work. Currently, 50 of our churches have each received Strategic Mission Grants to support their newcomer and other evangelism initiatives. These grants totaling \$1 million dollars in 2015 are funded by the Quin, Episcopal Church and Great Commission Foundations of our diocese. Their willingness to support you directly is exemplary of our collective commitment to evangelism and our missionary emphasis.

We have provided and will continue to provide Mary Parmer's training for Invite, Welcome and Connect. Dates for spring trainings are March 9 at Christ Church Cathedral and March 16 at Seminary of the Southwest in Austin. The really important upcoming event is the large national Invite, Welcome, Connect Summit conference at Camp Allen this April 30-May 2, with inspiring keynoters including Bishop Michael Curry, renown for his preaching and Michael Harvey founder of Back to Church Sunday, who is returning from England to Texas by popular demand. In addition there will be practical workshops covering all aspects of invite, welcome and connect to resource you with some of the best practices happening around the country in the Episcopal Church. This is a hugely important, must attend conference! Send teams of staff and others involved in your newcomer and evangelism ministries. Registration is now open on the Camp Allen website.

And to support the creation of missional communities, we will have a special Seminar on Missional Communities which will not only feature Bishop Doyle but will include stories from churches already involved in this work. This one day seminar will be held in the Houston area on Saturday, August 22. Make a note of that date and watch for more information in the Diolog as the summer approaches.

The diocese continues the critical work of planting new churches the newest being Church of the Cross, Lake Travis, led by the Rev. Paul Johnson which the Bishop will designate on Feb. 15 as an official Episcopal fellowship. Last year I shared with you the locations identified around the diocese for new starts. There are a number of them in different stages of development. Some will be traditional with land, some without bricks and mortar, some will be second campuses of existing congregations and some will take forms we don't currently comprehend. Some will grow out of the missional communities of your congregations not yet created. One thing is for sure, the Gospel imperative requires all of us working together to make this happen.

Last year at council we celebrated St. Mary Magdalene Episcopal Church becoming a mission. The Rev. Alex Montes Veja has ably led this multi-cultural congregation for a number of years in the constraints of a public school building. Finally, last December, they moved into their new church building and it sits like a beacon on a hill in Manor for all to see. Moves always bring change and Alex created a video for us to catch a glimpse of their life before and after their new building. It focuses on the ministry of their trailer.

Let's take a moment to witness the journey of St. Mary Magdalene and how the ministry of their trailer lives on. (Play video of St. Mary Magdalene Trailer Ministry.)

So the work of establishing new congregations continues. And finally, I would like to mention a number of churches that are in some stage of developing second campuses. A number of years ago Grace Episcopal Church, Georgetown established the first second campus in recent history in the Diocese of Texas. Most recently Christ Church Tyler is in significant stages of planning for the Christ Church Tyler-South Campus. And Good Shepherd Austin has beautifully remodeled one of our vacant churches, now named Good Shepherd on the Hill and it too is in late stage development prior to opening. Just in the last week St. Michael's Austin has approved the opening of a second campus in a school and it has the temporary name of St. Michael's South Mopac and will open on Palm Sunday. We applaud the faithful efforts of these churches to decide to second campus and to do that work well. Today we would like to recognize the opening of the most recent second campus in our diocese. It is named Mosaic, and is the extension of St. Andrew's, Pearland. For years this church has dreamed of having a second campus and this is what the Rev. Jim Liberatore, rector of St. Andrew's says about Mosaic:

"Mosaic is a campus of St. Andrew's organized around building relationships with those in west Pearland who do not think of church or who are estranged from church. This is an outreach campus designed to give people an opportunity to make a difference and find connections. They are also a laboratory for trying out new worship, missional communities, and other ways to reach the unchurched, especially millennials. And then he ended by saying, "These people are crazy."

Please welcome The Rev. Jim Liberatore, Debbie Allensworth, the Mosaic campus minister and others from St. Andrew's. We invite you to ring the Great Commission bell. (Group rings bell.)

Bishop, this concludes my report.

Bishop Doyle then made the first of his addresses to the 166th Annual Council ("Evangelism" - a copy of which can be found elsewhere in this volume). Concluding this address, the Bishop declared a short break. When Council reconvened, the Bishop called for the report of the Committee on Constitution and Canons.

Maria Boyce, chair of the Committee on Constitution and Canons, began the report of that committee. (The complete report of the Committee may be found on pages 3–97 of volume I of the Journal of the 166th Council.) The Committee moved the adoption on a second reading of the proposed revision to Article 9 of the Constitution. A 2/3 vote by Orders being required, the vote was taken and the revision was adopted. The Committee then moved the adoption on a second reading of the proposed revision to Article 10 of the Constitution. A 2/3 vote by orders being required, the vote was taken and the revision was adopted.

The Committee presented for a first reading the following five proposed Constitutional revisions: Article 2 (two), Article 4, Article 6, and Article 7. (The complete text of these proposed revisions may be found in the report of the Committee in volume I of the *Journal*.)

The Committee on Constitution and Canons then moved twenty-two canonical amendments as an omnibus measure. (The complete copy of the proposed revisions may be found in the report of the Committee in volume I of the *Journal*.) Following brief discussion, the omnibus proposal was adopted by a unanimous voice vote.

Chris Duncan, chair of the Committee on Nominations, began the presentation of the report of that committee by placing in nomination the name of Robert J. Biehl as Secretary of the Diocese. There being no further nominations, the motion was adopted on a voice vote that Mr. Biehl be elected.

Nominated by the Committee for Secretary of the Diocese was John A. Logan, Jr. There being no further nominations, the motion was adopted on a voice vote that Canon Logan be elected.

Nominated by the Committee for the Standing Committee (lay order) Rebecca Brindley, Rhoda Fanning, and Andy Vickery. There being no further nominations, nominations were closed.

Nominated by the Committee for the Standing Committee (clergy order) were Meredith Holt, Pedro Lopez, and Mark Marmon There being no further nominations, nominations were closed.

Nominated by the Committee for the Executive Board (lay order) were Steve Cook, Lewis Foxhall, John Hancock, Scott Madison, Ellen Mallay, S. Wayne Mathis, Priscilla Plumb, Rob Rowland, and Ed Ziegler. There being no further nominations, nominations were closed.

Nominated by the Committee for the Executive Board (clergy order) were Nancy Deforest, Wendy Huber, Beth Magill, and Mitch Tollett. There being no further nominations, nominations were closed.

Nominated by the Committee for trustee of the Church Corporation were Mark Browning, and Jolynn Free. There being no further nominations, nominations were closed.

Nominated by the Committee for trustee of the University of the South were William Gage, and Seth Hinkley. There being no further nominations, nominations were closed.

The election procedure was then explained. Before the first ballot was taken the Chaplain led the Council in prayer.

Bob Biehl, treasurer, presented the 2014 financial report of the diocese (see elsewhere in this *Journal* for details). The Diocese had ended the year in good financial condition. The motion to accept the report was made, and adopted on a voice vote.

Sam Dodson, for the Finance Committee, presented the recommended 2015 Unified Diocesan Balanced Budget (see elsewhere in this *Journal* for details) of \$9,014,000.00 and moved its adoption. Following explanations, there being no discussion, the budget was adopted on a unanimous voice vote. It was noted that "clean" audit reports had again been received.

The Chaplain led Council in Noon Day prayers and prayers for those lay persons and clergy who had served the Diocese in past years and had departed this life since the 165th Council (the complete list may be found elsewhere in this *Journal*).

John Newton presented a report on Christian Formation with attention on Youth and Campus Ministry. Lindsey Limbaugh spoke briefly to the Council. The Youth Delegates present at the 166th Council were presented.

Bishop Harrison introduced Iliana Gilman, the new Executive Director of El Buen Samaritano in Austin who spoke briefly to Council about her work. Bishop Fisher introduced the Reverend Freda Marie Brown, the new Director of Saint Vincent's House, Galveston, who spoke briefly to Council.

The Diocesan Treasurer moved that the offering received at Council totaling \$6,411.25 be given to the Hope Project, Tenaha, Texas. Jean Diebolt, Executive Director of the Hope Project was recognized with applause by /Council The motion was adopted. Bishop Doyle announced that the Bishop's Award for Ministry was being awarded to Jean Diebolt, "She and her team do exemplary ministry." (Bishop Doyle)

The results of ballot #1 were announced. For the Standing Committee, Lay, Rhoda Fanning was elected. For Standing Committee, Clergy, Pedro Lopez was elected. A run-off for the Executive Board, Lay, was scheduled between Lewis Foxhall, John Hancock, Scott Madison, Ellen Mallay, Priscilla Plumb, and Ed Ziegler. Elected to the Executive Board, Clergy, were Beth

Magill and Mitch Tollett. Elected to the Church Corporation was JoLynn Free. Elected as a Trustee for The University of the South, was Seth Hinkley.

Prior to taking the second ballot, the Chaplain led the Council in prayer. Ballot #2 was then taken.

Clergy new to the Diocese since the 165th Council were introduced.

The Chaplain led the Council in Noon Day Prayers. Prayers were offered for those who had served the Diocese in the past and who had departed this life since the 165th Council.

Council adjourned for lunch.

When Council resumed after lunch the Bishop gave his second address ("Service"). (A copy of which may be found elsewhere in this *Journal*) following which delegates were asked to discuss ways in which the Diocese could be helpful in doing service.

The results of the second ballot were announced. Elected to the Executive Board were John Hancock, Ellen Mallay, and Ed Ziegler.

There being no regular resolutions, the Courtesy Resolutions were then introduced and moved together for adoption. The motion was adopted. (A complete copy of the Courtesy Resolutions introduced at the 166th Council may be found in volume I of the *Journal*.)

Nominations by the Bishop for election were made and adopted on a voice vote.

Appointments canonically required to be made by the Bishop were announced.

The Bishop made his third address ("Reconciliation"). (A copy of which may be found elsewhere in this *Journal*.) Following this address, the Bishop spoke about the future and the Diocese of Texas.

Mary Cloud, Council Coordinator, expressed her appreciation to the Council volunteers. The 167th Council will again be held in The Woodlands and on February 12 & 13.

There being no further business to come before the 166th Council of the Episcopal Diocese of Texas, the meeting was adjourned at 3.00 p.m. and was closed with a singing of the Doxology and a Blessing by the Bishop.

Bishop Doyle's First Address to the 166th Council

Evangelism

Generous community. We are a generous community who shares and serves. That is the title for my visit with you today. We're going to actually do it a little differently—beginning to model and think of different ways in which we can visit and talk together. So we're actually going to break it up into three digestible parts. We're going to spend our first little bit this morning, and then we'll have a time for you all to talk a little bit—and I'll lead you through that discussion period. Then we'll take a break, do some business, and then come back a little later on for the other two parts.

I want to say that you should feel free—I will not be offended—if you Tweet out or post on Facebook. You can use the tags that we are using, which are Council 15 or you can tag me at @texasbishop. So share insight, quotes, questions, "We think he's crazy,"—whatever you'd like.

So we continue now with—let's see—get that to go. Terry, I'm pressing forward—there we go. It's a miracle! It happened!

The first thing that I want to do is thank you for my sabbatical. It was—I think I was—to be honest with you, I was more tired than I thought. I made a lot of excuses about being together with family and other things, but it was really good to be away for three months, and I spent almost all of it with my family. I was—at the front end of that and at the back end, I had two business trips and I was very proud to represent us in the Diocese of Jerusalem and then, in the fall, in Hong Kong and Taiwan and then Canterbury as I came back. It was really a great time. During this last few months of the sabbatical, I was able to bring to a close a number of projects. One of them thanks to Denise Treviño and a number of our clergy and laity in the Diocese of Texas. We had been asked and we were able to translate *Unabashedly Episcopalian* into Spanish. That will be coming out in the next couple of months. That was a great effort on their part to help me do that. And then I finished a small book of about 400 pages called Church, and that is coming out in May right before General Convention. And it is my attempt to envision the future of the church. Virginia Seminary will be publishing that, as we go into General Convention and begin to think about and vote on what TREC has proposed—that group that went off and designed a new future. And then, in the fall, we'll be following up with a study guide for more reading with Bible study and to do projects called Generous Community. I could not have accomplished all of that without a huge amount of help predominantly from my staff who kept my schedule sane, and so I do want to ask Stephanie Taylor to stand up. Would you all give her a round of applause for doing that along with a great office? (applause) Thank you. Kay Ryan is not with us today, but she also—I got her here as a new canon and then said, "Hey! I'm leaving on sabbatical," and she did an awesome job—awesome job.

A couple of highlights as I went away and reflected and thought about things, I want to say that the past year we achieved a number of goals that were set out in the early part of my episcopate, and one of those is that we gave two million dollars more out into congregations than we received from you—from congregations—to do ministry. So we actually gave away more money back into congregations—put money back into congregations—more than we received from you, and I don't know of any other Diocese that's been able to achieve that kind of return on your investment. I'm really excited and grateful to Bob Beal and David Fisher, who are over here, for helping us to work that out. So you guys stand up and let us thank you for leading that for us. (applause) While you all have had a tremendous

amount of growth financially, we have been able to keep the diocesan spending pretty flat and, in fact, decreased it and I'm proud about that. We spent the year continuing to organize foundations and I finished a 360 review that I talked about last year. And then, we did town halls and I was able to visit with over a thousand of you, talking about the future, dreaming about the future together, and it has been a great time. As I did that I thought that what would be important for us today, after spending six years together and beginning our seventh year together, would be to kind of go back to the basics. In other words, we've reviewed, we've celebrated the great things that we've accomplished, but that we really needed to pause for a moment and remind ourselves what we are doing.

We are going to move to the next slide here, and this is—to start out I want to say that, in the Diocese of Texas—what I know about us is that we have clarity of purpose about our life together. Go to the next one. The Episcopal Diocese of Texas undertakes the mission of reconciliation which was given to us in the good news of Jesus Christ. We know that. We do this through the work of evangelism, right? God's mission has a church and we do that through evangelism—the work of evangelism—which is defined as—we've taken William Temple's definition—he said to evangelize is to present Jesus Christ in the power of the Holy Spirit so that people who come to know and trust in God and to accept Jesus Christ as their savior. So that is our work of evangelism. We also say that we take that work of sharing the good news, of speaking out the word, and we turn that into action as we serve. And so we do this through service as well. Our mission is undertaken through service. To serve God is to do that in the fellowship of the church, specifically within the fellowship of the Episcopal Church for us, and in the fellowship of our community, so that we serve God both in our church and in our community. We believe that when we do this together—when we do this we begin to participate in a living word, in the kingdom of God, as Father Farrar Capon says, that God has already seeded out in the world. And so, as we undertake this mission of evangelism and service, we are actually participating in the kingdom of God.

Now, what I have come to understand and believe, after six years—and almost eleven years in the diocesan office are just a few things that I think are worth saying. One is that I have come to know that we have a complex group of stakeholders: parishioners, leaders, clergy, and foundations, and all of you seem to have an opinion about how we should do this. (laughter) Which is great—it's great—it's just I want to note—I think we just ought to say it out loud—that is a level of incredible complexity. This is the other thing that I think is important for us to recognize and say, and that is that conventional thinking is not going to help us get to the kingdom of God. That we have to use a more system-type approach that understands an organic and interconnected nature of our life together and our ministry. In other words, it can't be linear. We have to realize this kind of interconnected web that we have. And then, the other thing is that we have to build upon our shared mind and our shared goals. In other words, as we are unified in our understanding of that mission work, as we see clearly the work of evangelism and service for one another, we want to actually build the conversation—build upon that unity and mission, if you will.

Here's the other thing. There are going to be delays along the way, and it's going to be slow in the beginning. But in this kind of approach where we slowly, methodically begin to press on all parts of the system, the growth will be exponential. It's going to multiply. We have achieved growth in our membership over the last number of years, and we have achieved growth in our average Sunday attendance this year, but it is slow and it is wobbly. And the tendency in a more linear system would be to say, "Well, it's not working." But we have theories and believe that what we're doing and how we're

doing it will, in the long run, begin to slowly build upon small successes, which will lead to larger successes. So we don't want to give up, but continue to focus and be attentive to that, because the danger is that, as we become impatient, we start making too many shifts in the system, right? Or when we have one little bit of success we go, "Ah! Thank God, it's done. Whew! Glad that's over. Now I don't have to go invite anybody else to church—my one person came." We can't shrink from the task, as it were. We actually have a system of evangelism that we've been talking about over the last five years and I want to share—and that's the topic of this first section—we're going to spend just a few minutes on this, and then I want you all to talk about it.

So we have defined evangelism. We know what that is. To evangelize is to present Jesus Christ and the power of the Holy Spirit. So we know we have our definition. We use it all the time. So, this is our first theory, and I think it's a good bet because you do it with movies. People what they love, right? In movies and books—they share what they love. We know that this is true and we love this church, right? But people share what they love. That is our first theory in our system. The second theory is this. When people experience the holy—when they experience peace and love, they will share it with other people, right? So we know that that also is true. We believe that to be true.

Our third theory is this: We share through relationships. You don't share privately by yourself. You actually share with other people, and that we know that we have to increase those relationships in order to do the sharing. So we share within our Christian communities inside, we disciple one another, we share our story with one another inside of our community, and we do that fairly well. But that is one way that we share. We also are going to, and are supposed to, and are called to, and, I believe that when we really love, we will share outside of our churches, out in the world. It's a shocker. I got you on that one, didn't I? You were like, "What?! I didn't know that!" So we have a few stumbling blocks. We know what our job is, right? As evangelists and we know what happens when we share, but we have some stumbling blocks. And I always think we need to name those and be honest and that is, when we don't feel good about our church, we don't share. Sharing is directly proportionate to how good you are feeling about your church and your church community.

The next one is, if there is a lack of resources we tend not to share. If there is a sense of scarcity in the community, we don't share. If there is a lack of supportive leaders, right? If you are too exhausted to share or you feel like you are a lone ranger in the thing, that's a stumbling block for us. We fear sharing our story and being rejected. That is a stumbling block. I mean, we get down inside and we're worried, "What will they think? What if we offend them or they don't like me because I offer this to them?" That is very real. And then, also, if there are transitions and conflict in our congregations, we tend not to share during those times. So we also know, right?—we know then what the stumbling blocks are to our sharing.

Now, we're not left, though without some assets. We have some assets. Every church has assets. Big, small, no matter what size, you have some assets. Our diocese has assets that we begin to use in this work. So we overcome our stumbling blocks when we use these assets to create growth engines. Let's just name a couple of them. One asset is diocesan staff, right? So that's an asset—people power. We have foundations. The foundations of the Diocese are focused on evangelism. Those that are focused on evangelism have coaching power. They also have dollar power, some resource power for us that we have been able to use for this. Congregational leadership, both lay and clergy, that is an asset. And we use those and can use those better. We have cadres of leaders, teachers, coaches, and specialists that

we use to multiply and amplify what we have locally. And when we use this—when we use this system—what we take and do is we take these assets and we focus them and we systemically and in sync put these assets to bring energy into the communities to help overcome and break down those stumbling blocks. So when we do this—when we take these assets—what we are doing in the Diocese of Texas is creating growth engines. And the first one is to raise up clergy and lay leaders to lead, plant, renew, and grow Christian communities. So you heard about the Lona School and Seminary of the Southwest? We are doing that intentionally. And I need you all to do this, all right? One of the ways in which—this is not just something that the bishop does or the commission on ministry does—but every church is called to raise up leaders to help us multiply the leaders to lead, plant, renew, and grow our communities.

The next one is to create and incentivize new behaviors. Now, this is one of the things that I know about you all-you love money! (laughter) You love money. It's just true. We like it, and the opportunity to be able to get a grant is really awesome and so we incentivize—you might not have noticed—but we are incentivizing new behavior with our grants, right? So would you like a grant? Well, yes. Well, guess what? You are going to have to apply for one of the invite, welcome and connect grants. Now, we just finished this 360 review and this is what I want to just name as one of our issues. We asked people to self-select which one of these were you most likely to do and everybody picked welcome and connect. I mean like two people in the diocese out of a thousand people said that they had a gift of invitation. Really?! So we are going to be focusing some grants on teaching you guys how to invite. I think we need to kind of empower some giftedness around the invite piece, right? We also are creating grants to plant, create, and start new communities and of many different kinds. I'll talk about some of those in just a moment. But Mary said, "You know we're already putting a million dollars a year into grants for this work." We're getting ready to double that. So in the next two years, we will begin spending almost two million dollars a year back into congregations to incentivize starting missional communities, second site satellites, and then doing also the work that helps you become a good, attractional church of invite, welcome, and connect. We will do grants that plant, create, and start these new communities. Another growth engine is to renew, start, and redevelop older communities and we have used some dollars in our grants to go deeper into those communities, and so we see some of the work at San Pedro as a place. Grace Houston is another one where we are doing redevelopment work. So we have also the conferences that we run through the Iona School and the Seminary of the Southwest where we provide training for leaders and do that—I've already said a little bit about that.

So Christian communities, churches and colleges. The first thing is there really is—this is the model that we use normally, right? The normal way in which we, over the past, oh, fifty or so years is that we have been doing discipleship or attractional ministry. Every congregation, every size has really been doing this, and we use our formation ministries inside our Christian communities when they are at their best to create Episcopalian Christians who are prepared to tell their story. That is at our best—that discipleship work is working within the communities. And we use our youth and young adult ministries to focus on creating disciples and training them to take their place in the church in leadership, and not just at councils, but to actually do the work in congregations. But what is clear is that when we do that formation in the youth and young adult stuff well, what we are doing is providing for the next generation of leaders. In these communities what we want is a healthy invite, welcome, and connect culture. So we have to become the experts, if you will, in this. This is essential for us. You can't have attractional people and then they don't come in, they're not invited—they don't come in and they

aren't able to go deeper. We're going to have to continue to work on that. One of the things that I really think is important is that our worship space is welcoming, clean, and easy to navigate. And the truth is that we have a lot of work to do on this particular one. So we can invite people and welcome and connect, but they are used to going to very clean, well-organized facilities that are easy to navigate. We have got to be honest about this and begin to do this very real and important work.

Preaching and teaching is engaging and memorable, right? So we are going to have to make some space for our preachers and teachers to spend some time doing this, because you can't have them come in and not get a good message because they were too busy getting the bulletin ready for Sunday. We really have to figure out how, in our culture, we are going to make room for our clergy to prepare for their teaching and their preaching, and also how we can raise up leaders who are excellent teachers to help us. We cannot settle for second best. We're doing and offering this to God. We have to do this well. Now, in an attractional church, most people as you know serve inside the church. Think about the ministries in your church, right? They're almost all of them—almost all of them are lay readers, lay Eucharistic ministers. Think about all of the ministries that are all inside the church. Now, what I want to tell you is that that's okay, but as we do this—and you want to be an excellent attractional church those ministries better have meaning and depth and be about spirituality. So, if you're doing alter guild, that's not just about setting the table. We have got to really do this bit of work well, with real spiritual meaning, and honor the people who do it well. In an attractional church, which is just attractional, some members of the community are sent out to serve—some of them are sent out to serve. In the second talk, I am going to talk about the service work that we are getting ready to do. But here's what we also must become—So we have to be great attractional churches, we have to be good discipleship churches. But I know that you've heard me say and I'm going to say it again, Jesus did not call any disciples that he didn't make an apostle. He didn't call anybody to follow that he didn't then send out to go do the work, right? Everybody that Jesus called, he then blessed with the Holy Spirit, and sent them out to do the work that he had been given to do. So, yes, we need to be attractional, discipleship churches—that we have to do well. And then, we have to give up control and empower people with the Holy Spirit to go out and do apostleship work. That's what apostleship means—to go out—and we have got to bless people to do that work. I want to see in the next five years, that instead of a clergy-led, lay-supported church, that we become a lay-lead, clergy-supported church, all right? (applause) That's how we'll know that we're being apostles. That's how we'll know—when we are laylead and clergy-supported.

We have to free our people up to go off campus to do things like green field missions, pub masses, coffee shop Bible studies. We have to go out in the world to do our ministry. These are green fields. This is where we send people out to go do their Christian life making, praying, Bible study, all of that out somewhere that isn't in the church. We have members today—because some churches did this—we have members today who have made their way from sitting at a wine bar to being a missionary leader supporting the ministry of the church because there was a church meeting in that wine bar, a second site, a green field mission there. We have to go to where the people are. We can't wait for the people to come to us. We have to go out into the world. We have to be an apostle church. We have to send people out to do this work.

Satellite communities. You heard about Good Shepherd on the Hill—this is where we have—did you notice—I mean, if people say, "Well, how many churches do you have?" They'll say, "Well, we have like 152 churches, but did you hear we have five satellite churches, so that means we have 157

congregations. And then we have another fifteen missional communities." I'm going to talk about those in just a second. But we're growing the church by doing this, creating multiple doors in which people can come in, and so we need to have more and more churches doing satellite communities. This is where you replicate yourself and you send your church out into the world perhaps doing a different kind of worship, different kinds of ministries, but you are doing it out there, starting another place.

Missional communities are the other ones. These are what I call small batch communities. You have the mosaic community come up and ring its bell. These are communities where you send people out. A missional community is a community of service where you actually send people out to go live just like the satellite around a ministry area and serve and live and worship there. These are not people—in the satellite and the missional communities—they are not people who are going to come on Sunday morning to your church anymore. You are sending them out. This is not: we go out to do a little bit of service. This is: we are sending out apostles out into the world to multiply our communities. We have a great example of this in a lay person who is planting house churches by doing community organizing in Austin out of Saint David's—the great example of a missional community going out and being involved in the community and then creating house churches. So we have this system of evangelism. We aim, in the Diocese of Texas, to plant twenty-five new churches. We gave you those areas last year. We are continuing to press on to that. I think you'll see that next year we will have more satellites, and we will have more new churches to present here. We would like to see fifty new missional communities of some kind: a satellite, a green field, or the missional service communities that I've talked about. And I'm hoping—just as we had a huge group come and talk about satellites and now we have five congregations—I'm hoping congregations will come to the Missional Community Day so that we can begin to grow on that side as well.

So, what I want you to do now—and we're going to come back and do the system of service in a little bit—but what I want you to do now is—at your table there are three pieces of paper. You'll see them there. They're different colors, right? There's one that says Reconciliation, one that says Service, and one that says Evangelism. I want you to break up into your groups, your little Bible study groups again, who you prayed with and did some Bible study, and I want you to get out the evangelism sheet. So get the evangelism sheet. And, I want you to talk about ways in which the Diocese, meaning your diocesan staff and office, or your fellow churches could support you in undertaking healthy discipleship in attractional ministry and healthy apostleship ministry. So how can we help you? What are the things that you need to be successful in doing this? And So this is an opportunity for you to participate, and then we are going to collect all of these afterwards. Go ahead and do that. We are going to do that for 15 minutes, and then I will call a break, and we'll take a break right after that, all right?

Bishop Doyle's Second Address to the 166th Council

Reconciliation

One of the things that I know is that all we've talked about in terms of evangelism and service will always be held back by the level, or lack thereof, in terms of reconciliation. So we hold up reconciliation as a key ministry of God and Christ Jesus. We hold it up, and it is important for us to think honestly about it, and so I want to do that with you.

The first thing is this: Reconciliation is always and everywhere dependent upon our relationship with God first, all right? It is our relationship with God, our sense of God's help, salvation and grace and forgiveness that is the place where all reconciliation begins. Our reconciliation with others is always dependent upon our own honest acceptance of personal brokenness and sin, our vulnerabilities and God's grace and love for us. We might think of that passage from Paul's letter to the Philippians that Christ became lower than the angels, and perhaps that sense that in reconciliation, we should endeavor to be lower than the other who is before us, or we might think of Romans 12:10 that we are to outdo one another in honor. To outdo one another in honor.

The discovery that we are loved by God truly and honestly enables us then to love others as God accepts me just as I am, so too, we are able to accept others just as they are allowing God to work in our lives first and then in theirs. But here's the thing: this is a stumbling block. Reconciliation efforts stumble when we deflect our own fears, anxieties and sin on others and make the process of reconciliation about what the other should do or must do in order to inherit God's love, mercy, kindness and forgiveness, and that's how we get it out of order. It's a really slippery slope.

Stumbling block number two, the phrase, "I love them, but..." is a clear sign that we ourselves have forgotten how God has chosen to love us in spite of our failings and our shortcomings, hmm? How we respond to God's love is one thing. But God's love is given to us. That's why it's called grace. That's not cheap grace, but it is grace.

Another stumbling block is without a healthy vertical understanding of my place in the universe, which I like to think of as a very low anthropology, my efforts on reconciliation with others will forever be limited. Some teaching from our archbishop: Most of the time reconciliation is a very significant holding back. In other words, it is not reconciliation; it's learning more or less to scrape along with each other rather than to love each other and be reconciled to each other. The only genuine complete reconciliation, he says, is that one between ourselves and God by Jesus Christ. That's the only reconciliation in which the very depths of our hearts and beings are transformed by the action of God through a God who himself reaches out to us in absolute grace. This is particularly important because the church that engages with issues of reconciliation is able to be a reconciling community within itself and thus, and then only, a reconciling community in the community around itself where it lives and it exists. I think what's important here is to notice that reconciliation is not about agreement. It's not about agreement. It reorients us from the desire to tell other people how they should live their lives, so a humble position—a humble position at the foot of the cross of Jesus Christ—and then says, "How shall we respond with one another?" But it is not agreement, and sometimes, if I'm honest, I'd like it to be agreement, but it's not. It's not. So I want to talk truthfully with you. I have the privilege of representing our diocesan family in good situations and in tough situations. It is one of the gifts I have as bishop. It is a grace to walk with all of you, and you all are so very different, but is an amazing thing,

it is a humbling thing, to be your bishop. But I have to also share with you a little vulnerability, be a little vulnerable with you right now.

One of the hardest things that I do is to hear from members of our community how we hurt one another. In the last year, I had a good man sit across from me and say, "I know that people do not like me because of the color of my skin. In all of my thirty years, I do not understand this," he said. "I remember the thirty years." Then he said, "I am a good priest, and I want to preach the gospel of love," and he closed by saying, "Would you send me to a place where I can do that?" That is a priest in our diocese talking about the rejection he felt from a church, actually two churches, in our diocese. Another priest told me, "I am reconciled to the reality that people do not recognize my gay marriage, but I am a priest, and I have a ministry, and I want to work." Another person said, "We have been working for many years and made many progresses, but I still don't feel like this is my church." Another one: "Sometimes I feel as though it is okay as long as we stay in our segregated communities." And lastly, "I have been faithful for many years, and now I wonder if this church still wants me to be a member."

I am privileged to serve you, but this is the truth of some of the relationships in our church and in our diocese, and they make me sad. I love the diocese of Texas. Many of you in this room raised me, practically. But one of the hardest things is to hear this question, "Is this my church?" Here I am, I'm your bishop, and you ask me—these are the questions—these are the people—this is you! You ask me this. "Is this my church?" Conservatives ask me, "Is this my church?" Liberals ask, "Is this my church?" Traditional, progressive, straight, gay, lesbian, bisexual, transgender, men, women, white, black, brown, high church, low church, funky church (laughter), English speaking, Spanish speaking, everybody. Recovering. It's a long list.

The answer is yes. The answer is yes. Why? Because I'm your bishop, and I am the symbol of this church and this diocese. And if you in the middle of the night ever ask yourself if this church is yours, then you write me and you ask me, and I will say, "Yes," because that is one of the things as your bishop I get to do, is say, "Yes, this is your church." It's your church. And it's okay at times to not feel like it is. That's also normal. It's not—I don't want to deny it. I just want you to know that I'm going to say that it is. And I have decided—I preached this in the first bishop's address—I said, "All people means all people." Well, I'm tired. I've come to a point in my episcopacy in the seventh year where I'm tired of saying all people but not meaning all people. And you need to know that. (applause)

At our worst, we do this. What we do with this is either ignore one another or create a church universe where only certain people exist, and the diocese of Texas—we're just better than that. We just are. And the truth is that no matter where you found yourself in that list, you have tremendous resources and gifts for one another, and that's part of what hurts me so much. As your bishop, what makes me the saddest is that because we've decided to break off or break into these small groups where we're not really going deep enough in reconciliation work that we don't get to share the gifts like we could. I want us to do that. I think it's—that's my desire. And what I want to say about this is that diversity is not some kind of core value or a goal, but when I look at you and this diversity that is in front of me, I say, "My God, this is the kingdom of heaven. Look at what we're able to do together in all of our crazy diversity. And we don't agree. But this is it, working and focused in the name of Jesus Christ on bringing people to him and sharing the gospel and serving people. That's the kingdom. I may have a lot of questions for God when I get up there about that, but I know that here.

I want to say that I've been working with the <u>Union of Black Episcopalians</u> with a number of other commissions, teams of staff and coaches, since I got back from sabbatical on this issue—on this situation—to come up with a long-term approach on racism in every form. I do not think that at this point in our culture that we as a church can ignore the issue of racism. Now in the past, we got real into beating each other up about it, and we've got some work to do and we're going to do it, but as Christians with one another, brothers and sisters. We're going to figure out what I've done wrong and how I can change my behavior and all of that. That's an everything, everybody deal. To understand how it affects the culture that we live in, be able to spend some time going deeper, to increase our ministries in diverse communities, to raise up leaders intentionally from all diverse backgrounds, specifically to increase presence on college campuses where diversity is high but the Episcopal presence is nonexistent, and to look at ways that we in our common life might share and show respect for the diverse special days that are present in the midst of our diocese. There are a lot of very different ones and they're really important, so how do we do that? Just to take a step into this multiethnic diverse world that we live in.

Now I told you last time that both conservatives and liberals have asked me to deal with <u>Canon 43</u> to help stop the fighting, and I promised to go away and think about the issue and what I thought I needed to do and how we would deal with it, and as soon as I got back, everybody was ready to find out what I had thought, (laughter) which is probably good because I would have shied away from thinking too much about it, right? (laughs) I mean, that's what we'd like to do. But I've begun a process to help us, so let me tell you what I think my task is. My task is to help us deal with our disagreements on the issue of sexuality regarding Canon 43 specifically, and to do that honestly without dividing the diocese. (applause)

All right? That's one of the things I'm supposed to do. <u>Bishop Payne</u> called that miraculous expectation right there. (laughter) But I think that's it. I want to have a common sense that that's what we're supposed to do together and to help us deal with it without creating a win-lose situation, further arguments which get us nowhere on the floor of Council, and which in the end, create pastoral issues back home in our congregations. All right, then. (laughter) But I think that's what I heard. I think that's honestly what I hear from you, and I think it's important, and that stretches across all of the boundaries. Then I would say I'm to do this with all 153 different opinions that you have from every church.

Now I do think that we have a way and a means to do this, actually. I've talked about it. I've worked on it. I need some more time. I have talked to the major stakeholders and asked for some more time, but I'm not going to take forever. I will talk to the clergy because I feel like they're the ones pastorally who have to fall behind me in that we have work to do, and then I set them up always to deal with you all and the lay people and all their many opinions about this. So I want the clergy to be on board first, and so I will visit with them and I will work out a process and I will talk to them about that in October at Clergy Conference, and then we will talk with you prior to arriving here. There will be no surprises when we come next year. But I actually think that all of those things that I outlined there are achievable. Are achievable. I think it's important, though, for me to be transparent with you about this canon because I did go away and think about that, and part of the reason I want to be transparent is I want you to understand I'm not changing my mind. We're going to bring this to a close next year. So if

you're thinking I'm going to send the bishop a letter and tell him what I think, go ahead, but I'm not changing this process which moves us towards that, dealing with it next year, okay?

I want to be honest with you. I voted against it. Now those of you who have known me for a long time know that I voted against it. I've never hidden this. I've always been publicly honest about the fact that I voted against it. I would not vote for it now if I had to. No, no clapping. I know there are some of you—this is—I want you all to hear, listen. I would not vote for it now for a lot of reasons. I am against it. One of the reasons why I am against it is that it gives power to this council that it does not have. It gives power to this council which is mine as the bishop of this diocese. It is my power to ordain and deploy whom I wish and discern to be a quality person fit for ministry. It weakens my pastoral ability to do what I think is right regarding the clergy under my care, and it is not your business. You elected me to be the discerning bishop that I am on all issues regarding the ordination and selection of clergy. That does not mean you're going to like what I do all the time, but it is a power that is given to me as the bishop of this diocese. When I was praying over my thing, I want to say it also takes away—it came to me—it also takes away power from the Commission on Ministry and standing committees that are to advise me in this discernment, and it also takes away the power of churches to call whom they would call. It jeopardizes my integrity as a bishop and exposes me currently to potential Title IV proceedings, which would keep me from doing my job because I would be bogged down in that. We are blessed that that has not happened. It is an impediment to true reconciliation because what it does is it enables us to argue over Canon 43 instead of have an honest theological conversation about what we think about matters of great importance, and we think somehow that that vote will deal with those things, and it won't. They will be present with us and in this diocese for a long time yet to come. It gives an impression of this diocese which is not true to the outside world, and that is that we are bigots. And I am proud to represent us out there, and I defend us, but that's not who we are. Just because we don't agree on issues of sexuality and marriage does not mean that we are bigots. We have an honest division in what we think. That hurts deployment of other good leaders in many ways. Lastly, it hurts people I love. It hurts people I love.

The diocese at its best is a place where we have strong opinions and a place where we love and honor all people. At our best, we include—and I am committed to the full inclusion of—all people in our life and ministry. We relish and are proud of our unity and our diversity in gender, ethnicity, background history, languages, and we include GLBT people in all ministries where they have gifts. This is who we are. That's true now. That's actually who we are now. So we're going to go forward towards coming to a close on this business of 43. Ultimately, though, my goal is that we become a community of reconciliation and that through this work, we actually develop many tools to deal with future conflict in and outside the church and that we in this diocese, no matter what we think on these issues, all of us become leaders of healing, hope and reconciliation in Texas and as part of that process, we become members of the Cross of Nails, a reconciliation community out of Coventry Cathedral, but that we become the church of reconciliation, a diocese of reconciliation.

Now, I want you to talk about this in your Bible study groups. I want you to be honest. Don't hold back. I want you to write down and take notes on that last piece of paper about what you need from me and from the diocese to do this work, and I need your help in understanding that. You are the representative body, so I am going to invite you to do it. We are going to do it for ten minutes. I will give you fifteen if you're still talking and really into it, okay? So let's do that. Let's turn to our neighbors and do that work now.

Bishop Doyle's Third Address to the 166th Council

Service

So the first thing that I want to say about this part is I really felt when I came in—it took a while, even though I had been in the diocese in office—to understand how we were undertaking our ministries of outreach and service into the community. And one of the things that I would say is that while the Diocese of Texas has always—I mean as far back as I can remember—had a very strong presence of outreach and ministry into the communities. I really believe that more and more that I—I dug into this—I really found that we were doing most of those ministries out of—what I would consider—a 1930's model of doing outreach into the community. In other words, we had some things that we had been doing, and many of those things we had been doing for 10, 20, 30 years. And we hadn't really stopped to investigate, talk with, get to know our community and our neighbors. And so in many ways, we had become very separate form some of the major issues within our communities.

And so I started to work on a vision around a ministry of service, this kind of putting the evangelism portion of our mission work into hands-on ministry into our community. We set out a vision for what that could look like in diocesan goals and strategies five years ago. We continue to press towards that. As many of you know, we've put together a small group that gathered to oversee that work, to talk with me and reflect with me about it. And then when we were able to capture the imagination of the St. Luke's Episcopal Hospital Board—Health System Board and look at a transition, we were able to build this new ministry through the Episcopal Health Foundation to help us lead and service.

So service, a lot like evangelism, also has a system. As we said, that we served on in fellowship—in the fellowship of God's church. We certainly serve people in the midst of our community—our church community. But we also are called to go out and serve people out in the neighborhood and in our community outside of our walls. And what I would say about this, which is very important—and this is a word that's deeply rooted in our own DNA since—since Bishop Payne and maybe even before—but that is that we should be at the business of transformation of the community to make it better, to improve the livelihood of our neighbors. And some of you might say, "Well, I'm not sure that's a gospel imperative." And what I would want to argue with you is to say that yes, there was and has always been in the gospel a sense that we are to do charity—works of charity. But Jesus was intent on transformation and the restoration of individuals back into a normal place within the community life. In other words, it was truly about restoring individuals, transforming their lives, and returning them to a rightful place in the community.

So we need to be focused on that, and we have some theories about how we do service. We believe that people serve God in response to God's love, mercy, and forgiveness. In other words, we receive God's ministry to ourselves from Jesus Christ in the power of the Holy Spirit, and therefore, we are going to respond to that grace and mercy. And people respond out of what we have received and experienced.

People serve—the second theory—people serve through the church and some of our work is charity and crisis work. So I want you to hear that clearly. Sometimes we are called to do the work of charity and crisis. That can be a very important thing that the church does. And we can think about the flooding in East Texas. We can think about the <u>fires in Bastrop</u>. We might think about the <u>hurricane</u>

<u>that hit Galveston</u>. Yeah, we can do crisis ministry and we can do charity work. Just helping people to not move down lower and lower into depression and without any aid.

Right, so we—sometimes we have to take these stop gap measures. Well, we believe that Jesus was involved in transformation and restoration, and that all of the healings that they come—you know, he sends out the 70 that go out to do the work, right. It's not just about going out and being evangelists. Right? Of sharing the good news of Jesus Christ. But he actually empowers people to go out and heal people and cast out demons, right. So they go out and they have great successes. They come—you can remember that story. They come back and say, "Oh my gosh. You would not imagine the incredible work that we did in your name." And so we are engaging in that work as we go.

Our theory number three is that we serve with the goal of transformation of our communities and our neighborhoods. Theory number four that we serve to and with our neighbor to build communities that are healthy and well, and that we do this as we honor the dignity of the neighbor. Right, so we're not trying to go out and, "Oh, we've come to help you." Right? That is not the kind of ministry that we engage in. What we want to do is go out and say—because we have this commandment to love neighbor—what we do is we go out to the neighbor and say, "We love you. But we're on an equal plain with you, neighbor. How can we help you? How can you help us? How can we work to improve our whole society?" This the work of the Christian who is engaged in service. And we do that with great dignity. We serve with the goal of improving the quality of life for those who live, work, worship, learn and play in our neighborhood and community. This is our work. And I could believe that this is one of the most essential ingredients in the gospel as it came to live in the first and second century church. It wasn't something that happened out there, but it was in the midst of community and making a true difference.

So we serve our last theory here as we go through this is that we serve by aligning our churches and ministries with others to create an integrated and effective ministry within our community. So it's not just we're going to work with neighbors, but there are institutions and other ministries out there that we can partner with. And as we do that, we're able to multiply our resources and amplify our impact into the neighborhood around us.

Now, just like the other one, we have some stumbling blocks. Sometimes we feel a stumbling block if we have a lack of resources—if we have a lack of resources. Another stumbling block is that if we're overwhelmed by the community need and poverty and the complexity of the issues. How many of you feel overwhelmed by what is out there? I know that I do. The amazing number of issues facing our neighbors—it's almost too much to imagine. But I don't think that excuses us from having to do it. I just want to name it as a stumbling block. It doesn't mean, "Oh, okay. We don't have to. Thank goodness, Bishop. I'm glad you put that—that's a big one. Thank goodness." No. We have to engage it and know that we will have God's spirit upon us to do the work and to help us understand how to do it. But that's a real one.

This one too—if we do not have the right resources to meet the need or the ability to know where to begin the conversation. And this is—this is really important, because remember what I said about the outreach and service we were doing and are doing, right? Sometimes that was the need 20 years ago, but it's not the need anymore. And so it can be difficult, but we have to ask ourselves are we putting

our resources into the right place and order to make the changes that are needed to make a better and healthier and well community around us?

The other stumbling block is that sometimes we can be too satisfied with charity and not do the transformational work. I did that already. Thank you. But the work of service is a work of relationship with our neighbor. That's not over once we've done some good work. The other stumbling block, which I think is a very tender one for us, but we should name it, is that sometimes we believe that these are political issues only, and sometimes we feel that there might be a lack of understanding about how the gospel speaks in the midst of our time and our culture. And that's very real.

But it is time for the church to once again take its place in saying it's not okay for children to go hungry. It is time for us to take our place and say we have the resources. It's not okay for people to have to live outside. Right? You see what I'm saying? That we—we have the ability to say that's not okay in our culture, with the abundant resources we have. The solution may be complex. It may be complex. And it will take all of us working at it. But just because the politicians and everybody else who have so effectively solved all of this for us—oh, sorry. Getting a little punchy there. But who is there if we believe in a God who has sent us out to do the work? Who has God sent out? It's us. We are the ones who are sent out on God's behalf. It is—it is our baptismal code. We remind ourselves—every time I'm in your church, we're reminding ourselves of this work. But that is a real stumbling block.

But like before, we have some assets—75,000 people in the Diocese of Texas to help do service. That's a lot of people power. That doesn't mean that every one of those people need to go out and do it. Some people can support the people going out and doing it. Some people may need to organize the people going out and doing it. And some people need to go out and just do it. Right? Now I know what you all do, because I know how the system of evangelism—you just said, "Oh thank God. I'm going to be the people who pray for those people who go out and do it." And so that's a thousand of you. But that means there are 74,000 people out there that you all have to get out on the road and doing it—57 counties and 46,000 square miles. I think we can cover it.

Now we have people with expertise in our congregations. This is another thing that's an amazing thing. As we go around and we talk to our congregations, you all have a tremendous number of people with assets in your congregation who know how to do this work. They know. This is their work. And what an amazing thing to begin to be a church that blesses people for the work they're already engaged in doing and saying, "That's God's work. How can we help you do that?" So that is a huge asset for us. But sometimes—sometimes we kind of come into the community and we kind of leave all that outside. We don't bring that—so we got to do some work of discerning and getting to know one another better, so we know the incredible hearts and ministries of people already doing this.

Now certainly, we have the Episcopal Health Foundation dollars. Yeah, everybody's, "Oh, thank God." You all are saying, "Oh, praise the Lord." And Elaine is saying, "Bishop, I can't believe you just said that." But it's just the truth though. We have dollar resources. But I can tell you that throwing money at these kind of issues is not going to solve it. So we have an asset that we can use. That's true and we will use it. But if that's all we do, then we will fail for sure. Because the work of service, putting the gospel into hands-on ministry is about relationships. And so the money does not do that. It is important, but it doesn't do that.

And so as we've organized ourselves, the Episcopal Health Foundation has a whole staff oriented around and towards Episcopal institutions, congregations, eager to coach, support, and resource our work. So one of the most important things the Health Foundation is doing is getting ready. We've made the hires. We're beginning to understand how this is going to work. But they've got people out there who are going to help us deal with some of the stumbling blocks. We have a ton of community partners, which are assets. And so just like the other ... about a system. What we have to do is we have to take our assets and apply them into growth engines so that we can begin to do this work. So let's look at those.

But first I want to be honest with you about what I believe. I believe it is better to teach people to fish than to give them a fish. I believe it is better to repair the shop than bail water. It is better to deal with social determinants than to not participate in making life better for people. You can have a lot of money, but it's better to engage and invest in relationships. And it is always better to see the assets in our community and to see the human and financial abundance rather than the scarcity that we so often feel.

So some growth engines for you. Initiatives that focus on the increasing inclusion of community neighborhood members in our ministry. So this is work that we're going to have to do, but we have a ton of assets. We're going to begin to do that work. And that is going to help us move forward. Initiatives that support and strengthen systems in our neighborhoods by linking and leveraging various efforts which create value. We won't duplicate—we're not going to duplicate existing ministries just because we like them. "Oh, I love doing that." Well, then you can go work for that other ministry. We need to figure out how to create a web of service in the community that is really building a well community and raising the community up.

Let's see here. The next one—initiatives that enhance development of a community-wide vision and our goals and bringing people together in alignment. So one of the things we have to do is take our assets and really build a vision and understanding of what is needed. What is the real need in that community around your church? And how can we build a common vision? And that's going to take listening to people and engaging in conversations and doing that work. That's the kind of thing that we can do. But when we do that, we will see that growth in our service will happen. Initiatives that honor and recognize the dignity, contribution and assets of all participants, providers, and recipients alike. And that means that we can't just begin to think that this is about us doing it for them, but they actually have assets and things to offer in the relationship that we need to listen to and take part in. And our goal is to be a generous community sharing and serving. Right? So we're people serving people in our neighborhoods.

So what are we going to do? We're going to link—be linked with other congregations. So too often have we done this work in a vacuum or Lone-Ranger-ing it. So what we want to do is create an interest web of people who share common interests alike. So after we begin to understand what our communities are in need, then the next step will be to connect a community in Marlon with a community in Houston that has the same need, so that they can begin to share information, resources, understanding, learning, and do the work together. So we want to create a link—a web of congregations doing this ministry.

Congregations will share existing model programs. You all are already doing some really good work. But what we want to do is we want to develop—not just, "Hey, this is what we do. And this is where the model—the money goes. And this is how much time." What we want to do is tell the stories of transformation. What is going on? What are the stories of the people and their names and what has happened and how has their life been made different? And that is going to change the way that we empower one another for service. But again, if it's relational, it's not just about performing some program ministry, but we want to tell the stories of our neighbors, so that we know them, inspiring us to action.

Congregations will engage in best practice sharing and training with peer-to-peer support. Now this is the hardest thing, because sometimes we thought—we thought that maybe we could get away without some accountability, but we've got to get good at this. And so it means that we're going to have to be vulnerable enough to say, "Well, that didn't go quite as well," or "I didn't think worked." And we got to be honest with one another. And if you can do that, then we can create some momentum moving forward, taking the learning, sharing the learnings, and helping one another to better practice this work. To build and support stewardship that's more than dollars and includes listening to their neighbors, interpreting data, value and impact of ongoing work. So it's important to know the truth and the facts beyond just the people. This includes community organizing and learning how to do it and practicing it inside and outside of our parish. And you say, "Well, now what's that?" Well, that's actually where you go and listen to people. That's what community organizing is. It's got this fancy word, but the truth is it's gathering people in a room and actually talking and listening to what they believe is important. And we have to do it in the church and outside the church. Because then we build common ideas and a sense of what we're to be about and what God might be telling us through the Holy Spirit in those people's lives and in our lives as they come together.

Connection online to resources, creating learning communities of service. There are a ton of things that will be available through our websites, and sharing that and uploading and connecting and downloading. We really want to become communities that are—it's not just, "Okay, we're going to do this." And so we go—how do we learn together? How do we as a church engage in a work of service and learn how to do this work together? Consultants, coaches, leaders, guides—no Lone Rangers. People coming out and doing that work with us and together.

So we want to do that in groups in the name of God and to our neighbors, to improve their lives. And that's what our service is going to look like. Now we'll be able over the next few years to tell stories about what is happening. And I can already see some of this work beginning. We have groups gathering because of the ministry that we are undertaking where they're putting people together and talking about—in Waco—what's happening in that community? How can we change and use our resources? And in Tyler and others—so that's what we're going to be doing.

So what I want you to do now—have the sense of what—I think you understand we have a system of service and outreach. I want you to turn to your Bible study group that you had this morning. You now have another color piece of paper, which is green for service—green for service. And I want you to spend—invite you to spend 10 minutes talking about what are some of the things that you need to help you do this work better. So we're going to take 10 minutes and do that, all right? What do you all need? What do you need from your congregational friends and neighbors? What do you need from the diocese?

CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENTS ADOPTED

Article 9 PROPERTY

Section 9.1 Title to Real Property

The title to all real estate acquired for use of the Church in this diocese, including Parishes and Missions, as well as institutions of a diocesan character, shall be held subject to control of the Church in the Diocese of Texas acting by and through the Church Corporation known as "Protestant Episcopal Church Council of the Diocese of Texas"; provided, that (a) with consent of the Bishop, the Episcopal Foundation of Texas, The Bishop Quin Foundation, the Episcopal Health Foundation, and the Great Commission Foundation may each hold title to real property and may control, convey, and encumber such property without the consent, approval, or joinder of the Church Corporation, and (b) title to certain real property and related improvements, fixtures, appurtenances, and contract rights, as determined by the Church Corporation with the consent of the Bishop, may be held by and subject to the control of one or more separate Texas nonprofit corporations to be formed by the Diocese of Texas. Subject to the foregoing, all such property hereafter acquired for use of the Church in the Diocese, including Parishes and Missions, shall be vested in the Protestant Episcopal Church Council of the Diocese of Texas.

Section 9.2 Diocesan Property

Except as otherwise provided in Section 9.1, all property belonging to the Diocese, as such, shall be held in the name of the Church Corporation known as "Protestant Episcopal Church Council of the Diocese of Texas"; and no conveyance or encumbrance of any kind or character, unless it relates to property vested in the name of the Episcopal Foundation of Texas, The Bishop Quin Foundation, the Episcopal Health Foundation, or the Great Commission Foundation shall be valid unless executed by such corporation and as may otherwise be provided by the Canons of the Diocese. All permanent funds of the Diocese, except those funds held by the Episcopal Foundation of Texas, The Bishop Quin Foundation, the Episcopal Health Foundation, and the Great Commission Foundation shall be held and invested by the "Protestant Episcopal Church Council of the Diocese of Texas."

Article 10 AMENDING CANONS

Section 10.1 Authority for Procedure

Canons may be adopted, altered, amended, or repealed at any Annual Council meeting by a majority vote, unless a vote by orders be called for, whereupon a majority vote of both orders, voting concurrently, shall be necessary for adoption: provided that a two-thirds vote shall be required to adopt, alter, amend, or repeal any Canon, unless a copy of the proposed change to adopt, alter, amend, or repeal the Canon is first presented in writing to the Secretary of the Diocese or Chair of the Committee on Constitution and Canons not later than November 15 prior to the date of the Annual Council; but this shall not limit relevant amendments to any such proposal from the Council floor.

Section 10.2 Publication of Amendments

Any change in any Canon adopted in Council shall be published in full in the *Journal* with proper notations of title, number, and section, with a brief statement of the nature of the change. The Secretary of the Diocese shall post the *Journal* record reflecting the action by Council and the wording of the new Canon on the Diocesan website or otherwise make it available to Clergy of the Diocese, members of the Council, and others interested.

Section 10.3 Effective Date

Any duly adopted Canon or any duly adopted alteration, amendment, or repeal of an existing Canon shall become effective on the day following the date of adjournment of the Diocesan Council Meeting at which it is so adopted.

CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENTS (Passed for publication on first reading)

Article 2 THE COUNCIL

EXISTING:

Section 2.1 *Membership of the Council*

The Council of this Diocese shall consist of the following:

(f) Lay delegates representing the Division of Youth. The Division of Youth shall mean those communicants in good standing of a Parish or Organized Mission of the Diocese who are at least 11 years of age and no older than 18 years of age.

Section 2.2 Lay Representation in Council

Each Parish in union with the Council shall be entitled to representation therein by four Lay Delegates, and each College Chaplaincy in union with the Council shall be entitled to one Lav Delegate. Lay representation for each Mission in union with the Council shall be based on the Mission's Average Sunday Attendance reported in the *Journal* of the previous year's Council: Each Mission reporting up to 200 shall be entitled to one Lay Delegate; each Mission reporting between 201 and 400 shall be entitled to two Lay Delegates; and each Mission reporting 401 or more shall be entitled to three Lay Delegates. The Division of Youth shall be entitled to one Lay Delegate from each convocation within the Diocese; provided that, any such Lay Delegate under the age of 18 years shall have seat and voice, but without the right to vote. Delegates from Parishes and Missions shall be elected by the congregation, or by the Vestry or Bishop's Committee, as the case may be, which may, at the same time, choose an equal number of alternates. In the event that, of those elected, less than the number permitted is able to attend the Council, the Rector or Priest in Charge is authorized, and is hereby obligated, to make such selections as may ensure a full representation in the Council. Lay Delegates from the College Chaplaincies shall be appointed by the Bishop, after consultation with the Chaplain, if there be one. Upon being seated by the Council, those so selected shall have the same

standing as those elected. Lay Delegates from the Division of Youth shall be appointed by the Bishop after consultation with the Youth Missioner.

Section 2.3 Qualifications of Delegates

All Lay Delegates representing Parishes and Organized Missions shall be confirmed communicants in good standing of the Parish or Mission they represent, at least 18 years of age, and shall possess such other qualifications as may be required by Canon. All Lay Delegates from the College Chaplaincies shall be confirmed communicants in good standing of a Parish or Organized Mission of the Episcopal Church, registered students at the institution they represent, at least 18 years of age, and shall possess such other qualifications as may be required by Canon. All Lay Vicars in charge of an Organized Mission, or Lay Chaplains in charge of a College Chaplaincy must be confirmed communicants in good standing of a Parish or Organized Mission of the Diocese and placed in charge of the institution they represent by the Bishop. All Lay Delegates from the Division of Youth shall be confirmed communicants in good standing of a Parish or Organized Mission of the Diocese in the particular convocation they represent, at least 14 years of age, and shall possess such other qualifications as may be required by Canon.

Section 2.6 Time and Place of Meeting

The Council of the Diocese shall assemble annually on the Friday following the first Sunday in February at such time and place as may be designated by a preceding Council; provided that for urgent cause, the Bishop, with the approval of the Standing Committee, may designate or alter the place or time, or both place and time, in which case due notice must be given.

PROPOSED:

Section 2.1 *Membership of the Council*

The Council of this Diocese shall consist of the following:

(f) Lay delegates representing the <u>Division of Youth Youth Ministry of the Diocese</u>. The <u>Division of Youth Youth Ministry of the Diocese</u> shall mean those communicants in good standing of a Parish or Organized Mission of the Diocese who are at least 11 years of age and no older than 18 years of age.

Section 2.2 Lay Representation in Council

Each Parish in union with the Council shall be entitled to representation therein by four Lay Delegates, and each College Chaplaincy in union with the Council shall be entitled to one Lay Delegate. Lay representation for each Mission in union with the Council shall be based on the Mission's Average Sunday Attendance reported in the *Journal* of the previous year's Council: Each Mission reporting up to 200 shall be entitled to one Lay Delegate; each Mission reporting between 201 and 400 shall be entitled to two Lay Delegates; and each Mission reporting 401 or more shall be entitled to three Lay Delegates. The Division of Youth Youth Ministry of the Diocese shall be entitled to one Lay Delegate from each convocation within the Diocese; provided that, any such Lay Delegate under the age of 18 years shall have seat and voice, but without the right to vote. Delegates from Parishes and Missions shall be elected by the

congregation, or by the Vestry or Bishop's Committee, as the case may be, which may, at the same time, choose an equal number of alternates. In the event that, of those elected, less than the number permitted is able to attend the Council, the Rector or Priest in Charge is authorized, and is hereby obligated, to make such selections as may ensure a full representation in the Council. Lay Delegates from the College Chaplaincies shall be appointed by the Bishop, after consultation with the Chaplain, if there be one. Upon being seated by the Council, those so selected shall have the same standing as those elected. Lay Delegates from the Division of Youth—Youth Ministry of the Diocese shall be appointed by the Bishop after consultation with the Youth Missioner appropriate youth missioner.

Section 2.3 Qualifications of Delegates

All Lay Delegates representing Parishes and Organized Missions shall be confirmed communicants in good standing of the Parish or Mission they represent, at least 18 years of age, and shall possess such other qualifications as may be required by Canon. All Lay Delegates from the College Chaplaincies shall be confirmed communicants in good standing of a Parish or Organized Mission of the Episcopal Church, registered students at the institution they represent, at least 18 years of age, and shall possess such other qualifications as may be required by Canon. All Lay Vicars in charge of an Organized Mission, or Lay Chaplains in charge of a College Chaplaincy must be confirmed communicants in good standing of a Parish or Organized Mission of the Diocese and placed in charge of the institution they represent by the Bishop. All Lay Delegates from the Division of Youth—Youth Ministry of the Diocese shall be confirmed communicants in good standing of a Parish or Organized Mission of the Diocese in the particular convocation they represent, at least 14 years of age, and shall possess such other qualifications as may be required by Canon.

Section 2.6 Time and Place of Meeting

The Council of the Diocese shall assemble annually on the <u>a</u> Friday following <u>any the first</u> Sunday in February at such time and place as may be designated by a preceding Council; provided that for urgent cause, the Bishop, with the approval of the Standing Committee, may designate or alter the place or time, or both place and time, in which case due notice must be given.

IF AMENDED:

Section 2.1 *Membership of the Council*

The Council of this Diocese shall consist of the following:

- (a) The Bishop, when there is one, who shall be *ex-officio* President of the Council, and of the Bishop Coadjutor if there be one, and of the Bishops Suffragan, if there be such; and they shall be entitled to all privileges and membership in the Council.
- (b) All Members of the Clergy, canonically resident in the Diocese, whose letters dimissory have been accepted by the Ecclesiastical Authority of this Diocese, or who have been ordained within this Diocese and who have not, in contemplation of removal from this Diocese, applied for letters dimissory.

- (c) Lay Delegates chosen by and representing the several Parishes and Missions of this Diocese, which may, in accordance with the Constitution and Canons of the Diocese, be entitled to such representation.
- (d) Lay Delegates representing College Chaplaincies of this Diocese. "College Chaplaincies" shall mean those colleges and universities, and any branch thereof, in which the work of the Episcopal Church is approved by the Bishop for such representation.
- (e) Pastoral Leaders who have been placed in charge of a Parish or an Organized Mission, or Lay Chaplains who have been placed in charge of a College Chaplaincy, of the Diocese by the Bishop.
- (f) Lay delegates representing the Youth Ministry of the Diocese. The Youth Ministry of the Diocese shall mean those communicants in good standing of a Parish or Organized Mission of the Diocese who are at least 11 years of age and no older than 18 years of age.

Section 2.2 Lay Representation in Council

Each Parish in union with the Council shall be entitled to representation therein by four Lay Delegates, and each College Chaplaincy in union with the Council shall be entitled to one Lay Delegate. Lay representation for each Mission in union with the Council shall be based on the Mission's Average Sunday Attendance reported in the Journal of the previous year's Council: Each Mission reporting up to 200 shall be entitled to one Lay Delegate; each Mission reporting between 201 and 400 shall be entitled to two Lay Delegates; and each Mission reporting 401 or more shall be entitled to three Lay Delegates. The Youth Ministry of the Diocese shall be entitled to one Lay Delegate from each convocation within the Diocese; provided that, any such Lay Delegate under the age of 18 years shall have seat and voice, but without the right to vote. Delegates from Parishes and Missions shall be elected by the congregation, or by the Vestry or Bishop's Committee, as the case may be, which may, at the same time, choose an equal number of alternates. In the event that, of those elected, less than the number permitted is able to attend the Council, the Rector or Priest in Charge is authorized, and is hereby obligated, to make such selections as may ensure a full representation in the Council. Lay Delegates from the College Chaplaincies shall be appointed by the Bishop, after consultation with the Chaplain, if there be one. Upon being seated by the Council, those so selected shall have the same standing as those elected. Lay Delegates from the Youth Ministry of the Diocese shall be appointed by the Bishop after consultation with the appropriate youth missioner.

Section 2.3 Qualifications of Delegates

All Lay Delegates representing Parishes and Organized Missions shall be confirmed communicants in good standing of the Parish or Mission they represent, at least 18 years of age, and shall possess such other qualifications as may be required by Canon. All Lay Delegates from the College Chaplaincies shall be confirmed communicants in good standing of a Parish or Organized Mission of the Episcopal Church, registered students at the institution they represent, at least 18 years of age, and shall possess such other qualifications as may be required by Canon. All Lay Vicars in charge of an Organized Mission, or Lay Chaplains in charge of a College Chaplaincy must be confirmed communicants in good standing of a Parish or Organized Mission of the Diocese and placed in charge of the institution they represent by

the Bishop. All Lay Delegates from the Youth Ministry of the Diocese shall be confirmed communicants in good standing of a Parish or Organized Mission of the Diocese in the particular convocation they represent, at least 14 years of age, and shall possess such other qualifications as may be required by Canon.

Section 2.4 Other Members – Voting

All officers of the Council, members of the Standing Committee, members of the Executive Board, members of such regular or special committees as may be by action of the Council charged with a special duty during the interval between its usual meeting, and the President of the Episcopal Church Women of the Diocese of Texas, shall be members also of the Council, but unless duly elected Lay Delegates, shall be without the right to vote.

Section 2.5 Attendance

It is hereby declared to be the duty of every member of the Clergy entitled to a seat to attend the Council; and of every Parish and Mission to send one or more delegates. Each Parish or Mission is expected to make suitable provision, either by collection or otherwise, for the expense of the Clergy in fulfilling the above required duty.

Section 2.6 Time and Place of Meeting

The Council of the Diocese shall assemble annually on a Friday following any Sunday in February at such time and place as may be designated by a preceding Council; provided that for urgent cause, the Bishop, with the approval of the Standing Committee, may designate or alter the place or time, or both place and time, in which case due notice must be given.

Section 2.7 Quorum

At the regular Annual Council, one quarter of the Clergy canonically resident in the Diocese and a Lay Delegate from one quarter of the congregations in union with the Council shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business, but less than a quorum may adjourn from day to day until a quorum is obtained.

Section 2.8 Procedure in Meeting

In all meetings of the Council, both annual and special meetings, the procedure shall be according to provisions set forth by Canon.

Section 2.9 Deliberations – Voting

The Clerical and Lay Delegates shall deliberate as one body and shall vote as such on all questions and in all elections except in the election of a Bishop, or a Bishop Coadjutor, or a Bishop Suffragan. Each Clerical and Lay Delegate shall be entitled to one vote, and a majority of the aggregate votes shall be the decision of the question, unless otherwise provided in the Constitution and Canons.

Section 2.10 President Pro Tem

At all meetings of the Council, in the absence of the Bishop, or if the office of Bishop be vacant, a President *Pro Tem* shall be designated as prescribed by the Canons.

Section 2.11 Special Meetings

- (a) Special meetings of the Council may be called by the Bishop at the Bishop's discretion, or upon the request of a majority of the Standing Committee. Notice of the meeting shall be as provided by Canon. If there be no Bishop, the Standing Committee shall have the power to call special meetings of the Council. When a vacancy in the Episcopate occurs more than four months before the next regular meeting of the Annual Council, it shall be the duty of the Standing Committee to call a special meeting of the Council to fill the vacancy, in which event, the Standing Committee must give reasonable notice of the time and place and purpose of the meeting.
- (b) Whenever a special meeting of the Council shall be called, the business to be transacted shall be specified in the call, and no other business shall be transacted except that specified in the call.
- (c) At any special meeting of the Council, a majority of all Clergy entitled to membership and lay representation from Parishes and Missions containing a majority of the communicants of the Diocese as reported at the next preceding Annual Council shall be necessary to constitute a quorum, but less than a quorum may adjourn from day to day for three days for the purpose of obtaining a quorum.

Article 2 THE COUNCIL

EXISTING:

Section 2.1 *Membership of the Council*

The Council of this Diocese shall consist of the following:

(f) Lay delegates representing the Division of Youth. The Division of Youth shall mean those communicants in good standing of a Parish or Organized Mission of the Diocese who are at least 11 years of age and no older than 18 years of age.

Section 2.2 Lay Representation in Council

Each Parish in union with the Council shall be entitled to representation therein by four Lay Delegates, and each College Chaplaincy in union with the Council shall be entitled to one Lay Delegate. Lay representation for each Mission in union with the Council shall be based on the Mission's Average Sunday Attendance reported in the *Journal* of the previous year's Council: Each Mission reporting up to 200 shall be entitled to one Lay Delegate; each Mission reporting between 201 and 400 shall be entitled to two Lay Delegates; and each Mission reporting 401 or more shall be entitled to three Lay Delegates. The Division of Youth shall be entitled to one

Lay Delegate from each convocation within the Diocese; *provided that*, any such Lay Delegate under the age of 18 years shall have seat and voice, but without the right to vote. Delegates from Parishes and Missions shall be elected by the congregation, or by the Vestry or Bishop's Committee, as the case may be, which may, at the same time, choose an equal number of alternates. In the event that, of those elected, less than the number permitted is able to attend the Council, the Rector or Priest in Charge is authorized, and is hereby obligated, to make such selections as may ensure a full representation in the Council. Lay Delegates from the College Chaplaincies shall be appointed by the Bishop, after consultation with the Chaplain, if there be one. Upon being seated by the Council, those so selected shall have the same standing as those elected. Lay Delegates from the Division of Youth shall be appointed by the Bishop after consultation with the Youth Missioner.

Section 2.1 *Membership of the Council*

- (a) The Bishop, when there is one, who shall be ex-officio President of the Council, and of the Bishop Coadjutor if there be one, and of the Bishops Suffragan, if there be such; and they shall be entitled to all privileges and membership in the Council.
- (b) All Members of the Clergy, canonically resident in the Diocese, whose letters dimissory have been accepted by the Ecclesiastical Authority of this Diocese, or who have been ordained within this Diocese and who have not, in contemplation of removal from this Diocese, applied for letters dimissory.
- (c) Lay Delegates chosen by and representing the several Parishes and Missions of this Diocese, which may, in accordance with the Constitution and Canons of the Diocese, be entitled to such representation.
- (d) Lay Delegates representing College Chaplaincies of this Diocese. "College Chaplaincies" shall mean those colleges and universities, and any branch thereof, in which the work of the Episcopal Church is approved by the Bishop for such representation.

All Lay Delegates from the College Chaplaincies shall be confirmed communicants in good standing of a Parish or Organized Mission of the Episcopal Church, registered students at the institution they represent, at least 18 years of age, and shall possess such other qualifications as may be required by Canon. All Lay Vicars in charge of an Organized Mission, or Lay Chaplains in charge of a College Chaplaincy must be confirmed communicants in good standing of a Parish or Organized Mission of the Diocese and placed in charge of the institution they represent by the Bishop. All Lay Delegates from the Division of Youth shall be confirmed communicants in good standing of a Parish or Organized Mission of the Diocese in the particular convocation they represent, at least 14 years of age, and shall possess such other qualifications as may be required by Canon.

Section 2.4 Other Members – Voting

All officers of the Council, members of the Standing Committee, members of the Executive Board, members of such regular or special committees as may be by action of the Council charged with a special duty during the interval between its usual meeting, and the President of the Episcopal Church Women of the Diocese of Texas, shall be members also of the Council, but unless duly elected Lay Delegates, shall be without the right to vote.

Section 2.5 Attendance

It is hereby declared to be the duty of every member of the Clergy entitled to a seat to attend the Council; and of every Parish and Mission to send one or more delegates. Each

Parish or Mission is expected to make suitable provision, either by collection or otherwise, for the expense of the Clergy in fulfilling the above required duty.

Section 2.6 Time and Place of Meeting

The Council of the diocese shall assemble annually on the Friday following the first Sunday in February at such time and place as may be designated by a preceding Council; provided that for urgent cause, the Bishop, with the approval of the Standing Committee, may designate or alter the place or time, or both place and time, in which case due notice must be given.

Section 2.7 Quorum

At the regular Annual Council, one quarter of the Clergy canonically resident in the Diocese and a Lay Delegate from one quarter of the congregations in union with the Council shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business, but less than a quorum may adjourn from day to day until a quorum is obtained.

Section 2.8 Procedure in Meeting

In all meetings of the Council, both annual and special meetings, the procedure shall be according to provisions set forth by Canon.

Section 2.9 Deliberations – Voting

The Clerical and Lay Delegates shall deliberate as one body and shall vote as such on all questions and in all elections except in the election of a Bishop, or a Bishop Coadjutor, or a Bishop Suffragan. Each Clerical and Lay Delegate shall be entitled to one vote, and a majority of the aggregate votes shall be the decision of the question, unless otherwise provided in the Constitution and Canons.

Section 2.10 President Pro Tem

At all meetings of the Council, in the absence of the Bishop, or if the office of Bishop be vacant, a President *Pro Tem* shall be designated as prescribed by the Canons.

Section 2.11 Special Meetings

- (a) Special meetings of the Council may be called by the Bishop at the Bishop's discretion, or upon the request of a majority of the Standing Committee. Notice of the meeting shall be as provided by Canon. If there be no Bishop, the Standing Committee shall have the power to call special meetings of the Council. When a vacancy in the Episcopate occurs more than four months before the next regular meeting of the Annual Council, it shall be the duty of the Standing Committee to call a special meeting of the Council to fill the vacancy, in which event, the Standing Committee must give reasonable notice of the time and place and purpose of the meeting.
- (b) Whenever a special meeting of the Council shall be called, the business to be transacted shall be specified in the call, and no other business shall be transacted except that specified in the call.

(c) At any special meeting of the Council, a majority of all Clergy entitled to membership and lay representation from Parishes and Missions containing a majority of the communicants of the Diocese as reported at the next preceding Annual Council shall be necessary to constitute a quorum, but less than a quorum may adjourn from day to day for three days for the purpose of obtaining a quorum.

Article 4 OFFICERS AND ELECTIONS

EXISTING:

Section 4.2 Bishop's Salary

The salary of the Bishop of this Diocese shall never be less than five thousand dollars.

PROPOSED:

Section 4.2 Bishop's Salary

The salary of the Bishop of this Diocese shall never be less than five thousand dollars.

IF AMENDED:

Section 4.1 Election of Officers

Election of a Bishop, a Bishop Coadjutor, or a Bishop Suffragan for this Diocese shall be as follows: After special petitions for divine guidance, the members of the Council shall nominate some fit and qualified members of the Clergy for the office. A majority of the votes cast on the same ballot by both the Clergy and Lay delegates entitled to vote and present in Council and voting separately and concurrently by orders on such ballot shall be necessary for such an election.

In the case of all other elections of officers, or members of committees, or delegates, the Council may by unanimous consent provide that a plurality of all votes cast by the qualified voters shall be decisive.

Section 4.2 (This section has been deleted)

Section 4.3 Officers

The officers of the Diocese shall be as follows: the Standing Committee, the Executive Board, a Secretary, a Treasurer, a Registrar, an Archivist, a Historian, a Chancellor, one or more Vice Chancellors, and such other officers as the Council may hereafter create by Canon. All officers shall be at least 18 years of age and shall be confirmed communicants in good standing in some Parish or Mission in union with the Council, and shall possess such other qualifications as may be set forth by Canon.

Section 4.4 Time of Elections – Special Elections

The officers of the Diocese shall be elected at the Council at such time as the Council may direct. The election of the Registrar, Archivist, Historian, Chancellor, and Vice Chancellor shall be upon nomination of the Bishop.

Section 4.5 Terms of Office

The terms of all officers, if not otherwise fixed by the Constitution and Canons of this Diocese, shall be for one year and until their successors are elected, unless sooner removed by the Council.

Section 4.6 Duties of Officers

The duties of all officers shall be such as may be incident to their offices and such other duties as may be declared by Canon.

Section 4.7 Deputies to General Convention

- (a) The Annual Council next preceding the date which is one year prior to the next regular meeting of the General Convention of the Church shall elect four Clerical Deputies and four Lay Deputies to represent this Diocese in the said General Convention at any regular or called meeting of the General Convention. The Clerical Deputies shall be Presbyters or Deacons, in either case canonically resident in the Diocese. The Lay Deputies shall be at least 18 years of age and shall be confirmed communicants in good standing resident in the Diocese.
- (b) There may be elected at the same time four Clerical Alternates and four Lay Alternates from whom the Bishop may designate one or more as necessary to supply any deficiency in the representation. If there be no Bishop, the power of designation shall be exercised by the Standing Committee.
- (c) To assure a full representation of this Diocese in the General Convention, the Standing Committee, when necessary, shall appoint qualified representatives to supply any deficiency and such appointments shall have the full force and effect of an election by the Council.

Section 4.8 Delegates to Provincial Synod

The Annual Council next preceding the meeting of the Provincial Synod of the Church shall elect four Clergy and four Lay Delegates to represent this Diocese in the meeting of the Synod. The same provisions concerning the election of alternates and the powers of the Bishop and Standing Committee, as well as qualifications of representatives, shall apply in this election as in the choice of deputies to the General Convention.

Section 4.9 System of Voting

In all elections the voting shall be by voting machines or other mechanical or electronic devices or by ballot unless unanimously dispensed with. To facilitate elections, except in an

election to the Episcopate, the Council may adopt and define by Canon some form of the preference system of voting.

Article 6 SUSPENSION AND DISSOLUTION OF PARISHES AND MISSIONS

EXISTING:

Section 6.3 Failure to Pay Quotas, or to Comply with Canons

Provision may be made by Canon to suspend a Parish or Mission from the right of representation in the Council for failure to pay its quota of taxes or assessment, or to comply with requirements of the Canon, and provisions may be made in the Canon with reference to the vote necessary to suspend the Parish or Mission aforesaid.

Section 6.5 Aided Parishes

When a Parish for any reason deems it necessary to receive aid for the support of its rector, either from the Diocese, or as provided in the Canons by combining with another congregation, such congregation or congregations shall be automatically listed on the official roll of the Council as "aided parishes" until such time as that relationship is discontinued and the Parish resumes the entire support of its rector.

PROPOSED:

Section 6.3 Failure to Pay Quotas Assessments or to Comply with Canons

Provision may be made by Canon to suspend a Parish or Mission from the right of representation in the Council for failure to pay its quota of taxes or assessment, or to comply with requirements of the Canon, and provisions may be made in the Canon with reference to the vote necessary to suspend the Parish or Mission aforesaid.

Section 6.5 Aided Parishes

When a Parish for any reason deems it necessary to receive aid for the support of its rector, either from the Diocese, or as provided in the Canons by combining with another congregation, such congregation or congregations shall be automatically listed on the official roll of the Council as "aided parishes" until such time as that relationship is discontinued and the Parish resumes the entire support of its rector.

IF AMENDED:

Section 6.1 Action by Council

Any Parish or Organized Mission may be suspended from the right of representation in the Council of this Diocese, or its existence wholly dissolved, whenever the same shall be deemed necessary, by a two-thirds vote of each order.

Section 6.2 Action on Recommendation of Bishop

Whenever, in the opinion of the Bishop, any Parish or Organized Mission is essentially defunct, and the Bishop shall so report to the Council, it may proceed to suspend or dissolve the Parish or Organized Mission.

Section 6.3 Failure to Pay Assessments or to Comply with Canons

Provision may be made by Canon to suspend a Parish or Mission from the right of representation in the Council for failure to pay its assessments, or to comply with requirements of the Canon, and provisions may be made in the Canon with reference to the vote necessary to suspend the Parish or Mission aforesaid.

Section 6.4 Remitting Parishes to Missions

Provision may also be made by Canon for remitting dormant Parishes to the position of an Organized Mission.

Section 6.5 (This section has been deleted)

Article 7 SUPPORT OF THE DIOCESE

EXISTING:

Section 7.1 Council May Levy Taxes and Assessments

The Council shall have the power by Canon or by Special Resolution to raise money by tax or assessment upon the Parishes and Organized Missions in union with the Council for the necessary and proper expenses of the Diocese, which include the incidental expenses of the Council, the charges of the General Convention, the support of the Episcopate, and for such other objects and purposes as the Council may from time to time approve and direct. In making assessments against Parishes and Missions, regard shall be had as far as practicable to their financial strength and ability. The Council may, by Canon, prescribe such regulations and penalties as it may deem expedient to secure the prompt payments of taxes and assessments.

PROPOSED:

Section 7.1 Council May Levy Taxes and Assessments

The Council shall have the power by Canon or by Special Resolution to raise money by tax or assessment upon the Parishes and Organized Missions in union with the Council for the necessary and proper expenses of the Diocese, which include the incidental expenses of the Council, the charges of the General Convention, the support of the Episcopate, and for such other objects and purposes as the Council may from time to time approve and direct. In making assessments against Parishes and Missions, regard shall be had as far as practicable to their financial strength and ability. The Council may, by Canon, prescribe such

regulations and penalties as it may deem expedient to secure the prompt payments of taxes and assessments.

IF AMENDED:

Section 7.1 Council May Levy Assessments

The Council shall have the power by Canon or by Special Resolution to raise money by assessment upon the Parishes and Organized Missions in union with the Council for the necessary and proper expenses of the Diocese, which include the incidental expenses of the Council, the charges of the General Convention, the support of the Episcopate, and for such other objects and purposes as the Council may from time to time approve and direct. In making assessments against Parishes and Missions, regard shall be had as far as practicable to their financial strength and ability. The Council may, by Canon, prescribe such regulations and penalties as it may deem expedient to secure the prompt payments of assessments.

CANONICAL AMENDMENTS ADOPTED

Canon 1 THE COUNCIL

Section 1.1 Membership

The Constitution defines who are members of the Council of the Diocese.

Section 1.2 Roll of Clergy and Lay Delegates

A list of the Clergy entitled to membership in the Council shall be furnished by the Bishop, or if there be none, by the Standing Committee, and a list of the Lay Delegates, to be compiled by the Secretary from the certificates returned to the Secretary from the several Parishes and Missions at the assembling of the Council, shall constitute the roll of its membership. The Council may at any time order the correction of said roll in order that it may contain only the names of all the qualified members of the Council.

Section 1.3 Lay Delegates to be Certified

The selection of Lay Delegates shall be certified in writing by the Rector, Priest-in-Charge, or other head of the congregation (collectively "Heads of Congregation"), and if there be none, then by the Secretary of the Vestry.

Section 1.4 Alternate Delegates

It shall be competent for a Parish or Mission to elect as many alternates as it is entitled to delegates, who shall be allowed seats in the Council and shall cast the vote in the absence of the regular delegates; provided, the election of the alternates shall be certified as required for delegates.

Section 1.5 *Meetings*

Meetings of the Council are provided by Article 2 of the Constitution.

Section 1.6 Notice of Special Meetings

Notice of any special meeting of the Council, when ordered by the Bishop, shall be given by the Secretary, through the mail or electronic communications, to each member of the Clergy and to each Parish and Mission in the Diocese. If called by the Standing Committee, in accordance with Article 2 of the Constitution, sixty days notice must be given by the Secretary of the Diocese and by the same method provided above. Provided, however, that when the special meeting is called to fill a vacancy in the Episcopate, as provided in Article 2 of the Constitution, the notice may not be less than thirty days.

Section 1.7 Expenses of Council Meetings

The Diocese may charge a reasonable registration fee for each delegate to such Council meetings, to include a reasonable charge for meals and other essential services furnished delegates and Council. All fees and charges so received shall supplement any appropriation made by Council for such purposes, and shall be used to assist in defraying expenses.

Canon 2 THE DISPATCH OF BUSINESS FOR COUNCIL

Section 2.1 The Dispatch of Business

- (a) Council shall open with Divine service.
- (b) All business of Council shall be presented by or through any officer of the Diocese, any member of the Executive Board, any of the regular committees of Council, or as specified by this Canon.
- (c) The regular committees of Council shall be the following, and such other regular committees as the Council may hereafter create by Canon:
 - (1) Dispatch of Business
 - (2) Constitution and Canons
 - (3) Nominations
 - (4) Supervisors and Tellers
 - (5) Resolutions
 - (6) Council Management
- (d) All regular committees appointed shall hold office from the close of the Annual Council at which their appointment is made until the close of the next Annual Council.
- (e) The Committee for Dispatch of Business shall consist of one member of the Clergy and three (3) lay persons. This Committee shall present a report outlining the procedure of Council, with a copy of the Canon entitled *The Dispatch of Business for Council*. This report

may include changes in the procedure of Council set forth in this Canon, when considered advisable in order to facilitate the business of the Council. Such report, if approved by Council, shall be recognized in conducting the business of Council.

- (f) The Committee for Constitution and Canons shall consist of two members of the Clergy, two lay persons, and the Chancellor, who shall be an ex-officio member. It shall be the duty of this Committee to receive every proposed change, alteration, or new Article of the Constitution or Canons of the Diocese, submitted to the secretary or chair of the Committee for Constitution and Canons by November 15th prior to the next Annual Council. It shall be the duty of this Committee to change the wording of such proposals to conform to the Constitution and Canons of the Diocese. It shall be the privilege of the Committee to evaluate these proposals and recommend their adoption or rejection. The action of this Committee will be published in Volume I of the *Journal*.
- (g) The Committee for Nominations shall consist of seven members of the clergy and seven lay persons whose selection and duties are outlined in the Canons of the Diocese, and the Chancellor of the Diocese, or in the event of the Chancellor's inability to serve, a Vice-Chancellor of the Diocese.
- (h) The Committee for Supervisors and Tellers shall consist of two members of the Clergy and three lay persons. It shall be the duty of this Committee to secure such additional help from members of Council or responsible persons not members of Council to distribute, collect, and count the ballots or to supervise the voting in case voting machines are used.
- (i) The Committee for Resolutions shall consist of two members of the Clergy and two lay persons. It shall be the duty of this Committee to receive resolutions presented to it in writing by any member of the forthcoming or last preceding Council, or by any committee or board not responsible for the dispatch of business of Council, provided these resolutions, along with any explanation of the rationale for the proposed resolutions, are mailed or attached to emails directed to the Chair of the Committee. Unless the Bishop of the Diocese grants an exception, all resolutions must be submitted to the Committee not later than November 15 preceding the next Annual Council; but this shall not limit relevant amendments to any such resolution from the Council floor. The Committee may require all resolutions to be submitted in a standardized format and shall make such change of wording as is necessary for such resolutions to conform to proper usage and understanding. The Committee will inform the mover of any changes made. The Committee shall have the right to evaluate all resolutions and to recommend their adoption or rejection. The Committee shall have the right to rank the resolutions in an order of importance as determined by the Committee and present them to Council in that order. The Committee may request discharge from consideration by Council of resolutions, which would seek similar action to that of a resolution previously considered. A two-thirds vote shall be required to adopt any resolutions submitted to Council pursuant to an exception granted by the Bishop of the Diocese. The action of this Committee will be published in Volume I of the Journal. It shall also be the duty of this Committee to implement and set in motion the suggestions and directions contained in the Bishop's Address to Council. Those matters that come within the purview of jurisdiction of any particular Committee of Council shall be referred to the appropriate Committee for action.

(j) The Committee for Council Management shall consist of one member of the Clergy, two lay persons, a member of the Diocesan Staff, and the following *ex-officio* members: the General Chairs of the host committee for the current and the immediately preceding Councils, and Chair of the Committee for the Dispatch of Business. It shall be the duty of the Committee to assist the Bishop in: (1) developing and maintaining a Council Manual, consisting of detailed descriptions of each principal activity of Council, to serve as guidance for future Council Host Committees; (2) developing record keeping requirements and formats for Council Host Committees; (3) locating and securing appropriate sites for Council; and (4) making recommendations to the Executive Board and Committee for Dispatch of Business concerning changes in the organization of Council that would better facilitate the business of Council.

Section 2.2 Other Council Duties

- (a) Other Council duties will be carried out as follows:
 - (1) Credentials
 - (2) New Parishes and Missions
 - (3) Finance
 - (4) Unfinished Business and Certification of Minutes
- (b) The Secretary of the Diocese will be responsible for certifying the credentials of the officers and delegates present. Before any business is dispatched during any Council, a satisfactory report from the Secretary shall be made and the President shall declare that Council is organized for business. Before any further business is dispatched during any Session, a quorum shall be established.
- (c) A designee of the Bishop, or, if the office of Bishop is vacant, of the Standing Committee will be responsible for recommending to Council the admission of new Parishes and Missions. The Bishop's designee shall be ready to report at the opening of Council.
- (d) The Finance Committee of the Executive Board shall recommend to Council the use of any Offerings taken during Council meetings, and to study the cost of Council with such recommendations as seem advisable.
- (e) The Secretary of the Diocese shall prepare the minutes of Council which minutes shall be attested by the Bishop. It shall also be the duty of the Secretary to see that every committee, board, or person whose duty it is to report to Council does report. It is further the duty of the Secretary to see that every action of Council requiring a report be satisfied or held over to the next session of Council.
- (f) The Bishop, or in the Bishop's absence, the Bishop Coadjutor, if there be one, otherwise the Bishop Suffragan having seniority if there be one, otherwise the oldest canonically senior member of the Clergy present shall preside at all Council meetings. The presiding officer of Council shall be known as the President of Council.

Section 2.3 Annual Council Proceedings

- (a) Subject to such changes recommended by the Committee for Dispatch of Business and approved by Council, the business of each Annual Council shall include the following:
 - (1) The Order for The Administration of the Lord's Supper or Holy Communion
 - (2) Opening Prayer and Reading of Scripture
 - (3) Declaration of a Quorum and Certification of Credentials by the Secretary
 - (4) Declaration that the Council is organized for business and Appointment of a Parliamentarian
 - (5) Report of the Committee for Dispatch of Business
 - (6) Report by the Secretary on Unfinished Business and Certification of the Minutes
 - (7) The President shall appoint new members for the regular committees of Council to fill any vacancies on said committees appointed at the preceding Council
 - (8) Report of the Department of Evangelism and Congregational Development
 - (9) The address of the Bishop, if not presented at the opening service of Council before the First Session, shall be given preference whenever presented. The address of the Bishop Coadjutor, if there be one, or the Bishop Suffragan, shall be given preference whenever presented, or may be presented by title and printed in the Journal.
 - (10) Report of the Nominating Committee and elections
 - (11) Report of the Committee for Constitution and Canons
 - (12) Report of the Committee for Resolutions
 - (13) Report of the Treasurer of the Diocese and Treasurer of the Executive Board
 - (14) Additional Reports may be received at any time during Council that the Committee on Dispatch of Business and the President determine convenient and appropriate.
- (b) The following business must be transacted before adjournment:
 - (1) Report of the Committee for Constitution and Canons
 - (2) Report of the Committee for Resolutions
 - (3) Elections on appointment of the Bishop
 - (4) Appointment of members to the Regular Committees for the next Council
 - (5) Report of the Secretary on Unfinished Business and Certification of Minutes.
- (c) Council shall adjourn by motion and with the Doxology and Benediction.

Section 2.4 Special Sessions of Council

- (a) The following procedure shall open the Special Session:
 - (1) Roll Call by the Secretary
 - (2) Declaration of Quorum present
 - (3) Report of the Secretary on Credentials
 - (4) Declaration that the Session is ready for business
 - (5) Report of the Committee for Dispatch of Business
 - (6) Report of the Committee for the Special Session
- (b) The business conducted during this Session shall follow the direction of the Constitution and Canons of the Diocese of Texas.
- (c) The following procedure shall close the Special Session:
 - (1) Report of the Committee for Resolutions
 - (2) Report of the Secretary on Unfinished Business and Certification of Minutes
 - (3) Motion, Adjournment, Doxology, and Benediction

Section 2.5 General Rules for Order and Procedure

- (a) At all Council meetings the Council may take recess at its option.
- (b) Members of Council, officers of the Diocese, and representatives of the news media are the only ones to be admitted to the Council Floor. Boundaries of the Council Floor shall be clearly defined. All visitors may sit outside of this boundary as the space will permit.
- (c) Members desiring to speak shall rise, respectfully address the Chair, identify themselves by name and parish or mission, and confine themselves to the subject under discussion. They are to avoid personalities, irreverences, personal feelings, and experiences. Members shall not speak more than twice on the same proposition.
- (d) Written reports shall be submitted with a signed original, and one copy and accompanied by resolution when action by the Council is recommended.
 - (1) All reports to Council shall be given to the Secretary of the Diocese and shall become the property of the Diocese. When directed by the Executive Board, reports shall be sent by the Chair of each Committee, Commission, Board, or person responsible for preparing same to the Secretary of the Diocese, on or before a date not less than forty-five days prior to the next regular meeting of the Council, such date to be specified in a written notice which shall be given by the Secretary of the Diocese to each such person. These reports shall be published in a pre-Council booklet and copies made available, at least two weeks before the opening of Council, to all Members of the Clergy, Officers of the Diocese, and Delegates and Alternates who are to attend the next regular meeting of the Council. All such reports having been so published shall be presented to the Council by title. Any member of Council shall have the privilege of questioning the person responsible for such report.

- (e) Every motion or resolution shall be seconded and stated by the Chair or the Secretary before it can be considered, and if required by the Chair, it shall be reduced to writing and signed by the mover.
 - (1) Any motion or resolution, withdrawn without action thereon by the Council, need not be noted on the record. The Council may exclude from the record any motion or resolution which has been negatived by the Council or which has been ruled out of order.
 - (2) A motion to adjourn shall always be in order when no member is speaking, and shall be decided without debate; but if negatived, it shall not be renewed until some other business has intervened.
- (f) When a proposition is under consideration, no motion shall be received except to adjourn, to lay on the table, to postpone, to commit, to amend, or to divide said motions taking precedence in the order named. The motion to lay on the table is not debatable.
 - (1) A proposition once decided or indefinitely postponed shall not be considered by the same Council unless a motion to reconsider is made by a delegate who voted on the prevailing side and can show the same by three witnesses, and provided a quorum is present. If adopted, the vote must be by two-thirds of the members present.
- (g) Subject to the foregoing, the Rules of Order of the House of Deputies of the General Convention, where applicable, shall obtain in all deliberations of the Council, and shall be enforced by the President without debate, subject to an appeal from the President's decision to the Council.
- (h) Additional matters may be presented to the Council at such time as determined by the Committee for Dispatch of Business, consistent with the other provisions of this Canon. The Committee may limit the time for consideration of such matters. It shall be the privilege of this Committee to evaluate these matters and recommend the acceptance or rejection of them in the order of Business.
- (i) Any of these rules may be suspended by the concurrence of two-thirds of the members present.

Canon 3 NOMINATIONS AND ELECTIONS

Section 3.1 *Membership*

The Committee for Nominations shall consist of seven members of the Clergy, seven lay persons, and the Chancellor of the Diocese, or in the event of the Chancellor's inability to serve, a Vice Chancellor of the Diocese. The clergy and lay members of the Committee for Nominations shall be selected in the following manner:

(a) Six members of the clergy and six lay persons shall be appointed for rotating threeyear terms as follows: At the Council in which this amendment first becomes effective, the Bishop shall select two members of the clergy and two lay persons to serve a one-year term; two members of the clergy and two lay persons to serve a two-year term; and two members of the clergy and two lay persons to serve a three-year term. At each subsequent Annual Council, the Bishop shall select two members of the Clergy and two lay persons to serve three-year terms on the Committee, plus fill any vacancies that have arisen. The Bishop shall designate one of the members of the Clergy on the Committee as its Chair for the ensuing year. No member of the Committee who has completed a three-year term shall be eligible for reappointment to the Committee until a period of one year shall have elapsed.

(b) The Standing Committee shall select one member of the Clergy from its membership and the Executive Board shall select one lay person from its membership. Such selections shall be made at the first meeting following each Annual Council, and each shall certify the name of its selected member to the Bishop before March 1.

The Committee for Nominations so selected shall serve until the close of the next Annual Council.

Any member of the Committee for Nominations may resign at any time prior to November 15th of any year. Any vacancy occurring on the Committee for Nominations shall be filled by the Bishop for the unexpired term of the position to be filled; provided that a vacancy in the position of the member selected by the Standing Committee shall be filled by the President of the Standing Committee for the unexpired term of the position to be filled; provided that if no Clergy member of the Standing Committee is eligible, the position shall be filled by the Bishop from other members of the Clergy of this Diocese.

Section 3.2 Nominations

The Committee for Nominations shall meet annually, after November 10th, but prior to the deadline for submission for publication in Volume I of the Journal. Notice of the time, date, and place of meeting with the name and address of the Chair of the Committee shall be posted on the Diocesan website prior to the meeting date, and references to the posted information shall be contained in Diocesan electronic news publications distributed at least four weeks prior to the date of the meeting to all members of the Clergy entitled to membership in the Council and Parishes and Missions. Suggestions to the Committee for Nominations of the persons to fill all offices in the Diocese and representative positions on Committees and as Deputies, Delegates, or Alternates to the General Convention or Provincial Synod shall be submitted with complete biographical information to the Chair of the Committee not later than November 10th preceding the next Annual Council at which the nominations will be considered. The Committee is directed to choose from the persons suggested, and if necessary or appropriate, from persons it selects, the nominees it believes to be best qualified for the positions to be filled, being mindful of the desirability of a balanced slate of nominees representative of the diversity of the Diocese. At least two persons shall be nominated by the Committee for each office or position to be filled, except that this minimum number of nominees shall not apply (a) to the offices of Secretary of the Diocese and Treasurer of the Diocese or (b) to those offices to be filled on the nomination of the Bishop or Bishop Coadjutor. Additional nominations may be made from the floor at the Council. No member of the Committee for Nominations may be nominated by the Committee for any elective office, but such member may be so nominated from the floor.

Section 3.3 Notice of Nominations

The names of the nominees of the Committee for Nominations shall be posted on the Diocesan website and referenced in Diocesan electronic news publications distributed prior to the Annual Council meeting.

Section 3.4 Report of the Committee for Nominations

The report of the Committee for Nominations shall be presented to the Council at a time set by the Committee for Dispatch of Business. Unless voting machines, or other mechanical or electronic devices are used, the report shall contain sufficient copies of a ballot for use in voting, and shall show the names of those selected by the Nominating Committee. Nominations may be made from the floor. One or more groups of supervisors and tellers for the election shall be appointed.

Section 3.5 Voting

The voting shall be by voting machines or other mechanical or electronic devices, or by written ballot, unless the delegates shall unanimously desire a voice vote. If the voting is by written ballot, it may commence at any time after the presentation of the report of the Committee for Nominations. However, if the voting is by voting machines, or other mechanical or electronic devices, it may be conducted at such place and time as the Council may direct.

Section 3.6 *Elections*

Elections shall be by a majority vote of the valid votes cast for each office. A majority of the valid votes cast for each office shall be computed by dividing the total number of votes cast by twice the number of offices or positions to be filled and adding one (1) vote. Each delegate shall have one vote on each ballot for each office or position to be filled.

When more than two persons are nominated for a single office, or when two or more persons are to be elected on the same ballot and there are more nominees than twice the number of offices or positions to be filled, and if upon the first ballot there is no majority of the votes cast for one or more of the offices to be filled, a second ballot shall be cast. The nominees on such ballot shall be the candidates receiving the highest number of votes cast on the preceding ballot, not to exceed twice the number of the offices remaining to be filled; except in the case of a tie vote in the last place, in which event the candidates receiving the tie vote shall also be candidates on the next succeeding ballot. Similarly, ballots shall be cast until all offices shall be filled.

When elections are for different terms of office, the nominee first elected shall be the one elected for the longest term; or if two or more are elected on the same ballot, the candidate or candidates receiving the highest number of votes shall be the one or ones elected for the longest term.

In all elections where officers or positions are designated to be filled by both Clergy and lay persons, separate ballots shall be taken for each order.

Section 3.7 Election of Deputies to General Convention and Alternates

There shall be four Clerical Deputies and four Lay Deputies elected to represent the Diocese at each General Convention. A minimum total of eight members of the Clergy and eight qualified Lay persons shall be nominated to fill the positions. Each voting delegate, Lay and Clergy, shall initially have four votes for each order. Notwithstanding the provisions of Section 3.6, the number of nominees for each order shall not be reduced until there shall have been elected at least one Deputy from such order, after which the number of nominees from such order shall be reduced from those receiving the highest number of votes to twice the number of offices of Deputies remaining to be filled from such order. After a reduction in such order, each voting delegate shall have as many votes as there are positions to be filled in such order. The four members of the Clergy and four qualified Lay persons receiving a majority of the votes cast shall be elected as Deputies. Cumulative voting shall not be permitted in the election. Four alternates shall be selected from each order. The alternates shall be the eliminated nominees from each order receiving the four highest number of votes prior to elimination and shall be ranked in the order of votes received. If there is a tie vote for an alternate position, the precedence shall be chosen by lot.

Canon 4 DUTIES OF THE OFFICERS OF THE DIOCESE

Section 4.1 Secretary

It shall be the duty of the Secretary:

- (a) To record the proceedings of the Council.
- (b) To preserve the records, books, and papers of the Council, subject to its order.
- (c) To attest transcripts from the Council's records.
- (d) To notify promptly all persons concerned of elections, resolutions, or other action taken by the Council.
- (e) To furnish to Ministers, Parishes, and Missions prescribed forms for reports.
- (f) To certify to the General Convention lists of the Clergy of the Diocese, and the names of Deputies to the General Convention.
- (g) To prepare and submit such reports from the Diocese as may be required by the General Convention or by any other official body under authority of the General Convention.
- (h) To supervise the proper publication of the *Journal* of the proceedings of the Council, subject to the orders of the Council, and to post the *Journal* on the Diocesan website and otherwise make it available to interested persons upon request.

- (i) To publish in the *Journal* each year a page or pages memorializing Lay leaders of the Diocese and/or Council who have died during the preceding year and to publish a separate page for each member of the Clergy canonically resident in the Diocese who has died during the preceding year.
- (j) Do whatever else may be required by the Council.
- (k) Keep and report to the Treasurer of the Diocese an account of all expenses incurred under this Canon.

Section 4.2 Treasurer

- (a) The Treasurer shall receive and account for all moneys collected by authority of the Council, or deposited with the Treasurer for any Church purpose, keeping a separate account of each fund upon which any payments are made to him.
- (b) From each fund the Treasurer shall, as promptly as collections will allow, make the specific payments required to be made therefrom.
- (c) From the Diocesan Fund the Treasurer shall pay all expenses incurred under this title, pay the quota of the Diocese to the Contingent Fund of the General Convention, and make such other disbursements as the Council may order.
- (d) The Treasurer shall notify all Parishes of the assessment against them, and at least sixty days before each Annual Council the Treasurer shall notify the authorities of any parish in arrears of the amount of said arrears and urge a remittance thereof to the Council.
- (e) The Treasurer's accounts shall at all times be subject to inspection under the authority of the Council or Standing Committee, and a statement thereof shall be furnished annually to the Council.
- (f) The Treasurer shall give bond to the satisfaction of the Standing Committee, and shall deliver to the Treasurer's successor all funds, books, and papers pertaining to the Treasurer's office.
- (g) The Treasurer shall be a member of the Executive Board, ex-officio.

Section 4.3 Registrar, Archivist, and Historian

There shall be elected annually by the Council, on nomination of the Bishop, a Diocesan Registrar, a Diocesan Archivist, and a Diocesan Historian.

(a) The Diocesan Registrar shall keep in a separate book a Register of the Clergy canonically connected with the Diocese, showing the dates of the ordination and reception; also all dismissals, depositions, or deaths of the Clergy occurring in the Diocese. If the Diocesan Registrar is not also the Secretary of the Diocese, the Registrar shall perform such duties under the supervision of the Secretary of the Diocese. The Diocesan Registrar shall keep a register of all Parishes and Missions connected with the Diocese, showing their organization, admission, succession of Clergy in charge as far as it

can be ascertained, and such other particulars as may be necessary to indicate their status and history.

- (b) The Diocesan Archivist shall receive, file, index, and preserve any books, papers, journals, reports, manuscripts, pamphlets, or other documents pertaining to the Church or its history, and shall from time to time, endeavor to increase such collections. The Diocesan Archivist shall report annually to the Council the official acts and the condition of all material in the custody of the Diocese, with suggestions as to its arrangement, increase, and preservation. The Diocesan Archivist shall be empowered under orders from the Ecclesiastical authority, to issue a proper certificate of any fact of record in the Diocesan archives.
- (c) The Diocesan Historian shall encourage the appointment of parish historians and shall provide such parish historians with assistance in collecting and preserving the records, papers, books, newspaper stories, and other materials as related to the life and history of the congregation and provide for the writing of parochial Histories.

Section 4.4 Chancellor

- (a) The Chancellor shall, whenever requested, be advisor, confidential or otherwise, of the Bishop, Council, the Standing Committee, Executive Board, and other Committees and Boards and Diocesan Organizations.
- (b) It shall be the duty of the Chancellor to examine and approve all contracts entered into by the Church Corporation, and to examine and approve the title to all property purchased by the Church Corporation. The Chancellor shall attend to the proper registration of all papers affecting the title of Church property. The Chancellor shall represent the Church Corporation in any litigation affecting its properties.
- (c) The Chancellor shall be present at any proceedings for the settlement of any differences between Ministers and their Congregations, or for the trial of any person charged with a Canonical offense, and the Chancellor shall procure and file in the archives of the Diocese a record duly authenticated of the consecration of any Bishop of the Diocese.

Section 4.5 Vice Chancellors

Vice Chancellors shall perform such duties as may be assigned to them by the Bishop or the Chancellor. In the event of a vacancy in the Chancellorship, or the inability of the Chancellor from whatever cause, the duties of the Chancellor shall devolve upon the Vice Chancellor selected by the Bishop.

Section 4.6 Assistant Chancellors

The Bishop may designate one or more Assistant Chancellors for such term and with such duties and responsibilities as their appointment may provide. They shall assist the Chancellor and their services shall be under the Chancellor's supervision and direction.

Section 4.7 Qualifications, Election

The Chancellor, Vice Chancellor, and Assistant Chancellors shall be of the profession of the law. The Chancellor and Vice Chancellor shall be elected at each Annual Council on nomination of the Bishop and as provided in Article 4, Section 4.4 of the Constitution.

Section 4.8 Canons to the Ordinary

Authority is granted for the appointment of one or more Canons to the Ordinary. Each such Canon shall be a member of the Clergy, canonically residing in the Diocese, who shall be appointed by the Bishop. Such Canons shall be accountable to the Bishop and shall assist in the performance of such ecclesiastical and administrative duties, and shall serve for such terms as the Bishop may determine.

Section 4.9 Certain Bishop Delegations

With respect to the Diocesan entities identified below, the Bishop shall have the power and authority to designate the Bishop Coadjutor or any Bishop Suffragan or Assistant Bishop to be an ex-officio member of the Board of such entity, to take the Bishop's place as Chair of such entity, and to exercise all rights and powers of such Chair. Such delegation shall expire at the end of each calendar year subject to the Bishop's right to terminate such delegated authority prior thereto or to extend such delegated authority for successive one-year periods. In the event of any such delegation of authority, the Bishop may elect to continue or to discontinue serving on such Board during the period of such delegation.

The Diocesan entities to which this Canon applies are: The Bishop Quin Foundation, St. Stephen's Episcopal School, Episcopal Health Foundation, Great Commission Foundation, Episcopal High School, El Buen Samaritano Episcopal Mission, Community of the Streets Outreach Corporation, and such other Diocesan entities as may provide for such delegation of authority by reference to this Canon. If any inconsistency between this Canon and the Canon establishing any of the above referenced Diocesan entities exists, this Canon shall control.

Canon 5 THE EXECUTIVE BOARD OF THE DIOCESE

Section 5.1 Administrative Duties

The Executive Board of the Diocese, as hereinafter constituted, shall administer and carry on the Mission, Formation, and Outreach ministries of the Church of this Diocese, of which work the Bishop shall be the executive head.

Section 5.2 *Powers – Authority*

The Executive Board shall exercise all powers of the Diocesan Council, between meetings thereof, in connection with the unification, long range planning, development, and prosecution of the work of Missions, Church Growth, Christian Formation, the Church and the Community, Communication, and the Church Pension Fund; and in supervision and direction of the acts of the Trustees of the Protestant Episcopal Church Council in the Diocese of Texas, the Trustees

of the Episcopal Foundation of Texas, the Trustees of The Bishop Quin Foundation, the Directors of the Episcopal Health Foundation, and the Directors of the Great Commission Foundation for the performance of such work as may be committed to such diocesan institutions by the Council; and in the initiation and development of such new work between said meetings as the Executive Board may deem necessary; subject, however, to the provisions of the Constitution and Canons, and other directions of the Council.

Section 5.3 *Membership – Elections – Vacancies*

- (a) The Executive Board shall be comprised of the following persons:
 - (1) The Bishop of the Diocese, who shall be the Chair.
 - (2) The following persons will serve, ex-officio:
 - (a) The Coadjutor Bishop, if there be one.
 - (b) The Suffragan Bishops, if there be any.
 - (c) The Assistant Bishop, if there be one.
 - (d) The President of the Protestant Episcopal Church Council of the Diocese of Texas.
 - (e) The Treasurer of the Diocese.
 - (f) The President of the Episcopal Church Women of the Diocese of Texas, with voice but without vote unless an elected member of the Executive Board as defined in Section 5.3(a)(3).
 - (3) Fifteen elected members, of whom six shall be members of the Clergy and nine shall be lay persons who are at least 18 years of age and are confirmed communicants in good standing of the Church in this Diocese. At each Annual Council there shall be elected five members, who shall serve for a term of three years thereafter. Two of the members so elected shall be members of the Clergy and the remaining three shall be lay persons; no retiring members elected by Council or by the Executive Board, either for a full term or to fill an unexpired term, shall be eligible for re-election until a period of one year shall have elapsed.
 - (4) The Secretary and Treasurer of the Executive Board with voice, but without vote if either be elected from outside the elected membership of the Board, as hereinafter provided in Section 5.3(a)(3).
- (b) In addition to the members, the following persons shall attend the meetings of the Executive Board from time to time, as the Board shall require and for such purpose as the Board shall specify: the Convocational Deans, the Committee Chairs, the Chancellor, the President of the Episcopal Foundation of Texas, the President of The Bishop Quin Foundation, the Executive Chair of the Episcopal Health Foundation, the President of the Great Commission Foundation, and the Canon to the Ordinary. In addition, the Bishop may invite other persons to attend Executive Board meetings as the Bishop deems appropriate.
- (c) The members of the Board shall remain in office until their successors are duly elected. Provided, however, that should a member of the Board fail to attend one-half of the meetings of the Board in a calendar year, a vacancy shall be declared to exist and the

vacancy shall be filled by the Board. The Board shall have the power to fill such other vacancy in its membership that may occur through death, resignation, or removal of any member elected by the Council.

Section 5.4 Officers of the Board

The officers of the Board shall be the Bishop of the Diocese, who shall be *ex-officio* Chair of the Board and President, or the Bishop Coadjutor, if there be one, and if the Bishop Coadjutor be thereto assigned by the Bishop; a Vice President, a Secretary, and a Treasurer who shall be elected at a meeting of the Board immediately succeeding the annual Diocesan Council.

Section 5.5 Duties of Treasurer

It shall be the duty of the Treasurer to receive, safely keep and disburse, as the Treasurer may be directed by the Executive Board, all funds under the purview of the Executive Board, and all other moneys contributed or accruing from whatever source for Diocesan Mission, Formation, or Outreach. The Treasurer shall be required to furnish a bond satisfactory to the Executive Board, the expense of the same to be borne by the Diocese; and the Treasurer shall conduct all the duties of the office as directed by the Board.

Section 5.6 Administrative Committees

- (a) The Executive Board may organize its membership, staff and/or persons appointed by the Bishop into one or more committees and shall determine the scope of work for each committee.
- (b) The Bishop or the Bishop's designee shall be the Chair of each Committee. Any Committee Chair need not be an elected member of the Board. Such Chair, if not an elected member of the Board, shall be entitled to attend all meetings of the Board and shall be entitled to a voice but no vote. Such Chair shall be allowed to serve as Chair as long as the Bishop desires. Each Committee shall have the power to appoint, subject to confirmation by the Bishop, additional members, who shall have seats and votes in the Committee, but without seats and votes on the Board.
- (c) The Board also may enact all necessary bylaws for its governance, and for the governance of each Committee, subject to the provisions of this Canon, and not inconsistent with the Canons of the Diocese.
- (d) Each Committee shall make to the Bishop, annually, and at such other times and in such form as the Bishop shall require, a report of the work done under its direction.
- (e) The Finance Committee of the Executive Board may request Committees to report, annually, and request such funds as the Committee thinks necessary for carrying out its work.

Section 5.7 Reports

- (a) The Executive Board shall submit to each annual meeting of the Diocesan Council a report of the work done under its supervision for the preceding year, which report shall include the annual report of the Treasurer of the Board.
- (b) At each annual meeting of the Diocesan Council, the Board shall also submit for approval and adoption by the Council, a Diocesan Budget for support of the Bishop's office and ministry as specified in Article 7 of the Constitution for all the work for the Church in the Diocese, and such other work as the Board may propose to undertake for the ensuing year. Such budget and estimate shall be considered by the Council and appropriate action taken.
- (c) The Board shall have power to expend all sums of money provided in said budget as adopted by the Diocesan Council. It also shall have power to expend any money received in any year over and above the amount required for the budget of that year for the work under its administration, and shall have the right for good cause, to transfer amounts from one budget item to another within the framework of the budget but not to transfer amounts from one budget to another.

Section 5.8 Meetings with Bishop

The Executive Board shall meet with the Bishop or the Bishop Coadjutor, if there be one, and if the Bishop Coadjutor be assigned thereto by the Bishop, at such stated times as the Board, in conference with the Bishop, shall appoint; at least twice a year, and at such other times as the Bishop shall convene it. Six members of the Board, with the Bishop, or with the Vice President, shall constitute a quorum.

Section 5.9 Fixing Salaries

All salaries, other than those fixed by the Diocesan Council, shall be fixed by the Executive Board upon the recommendation of the Finance Committee of the Executive Board.

Canon 7 CONVOCATIONS

Section 7.1 Convocations

The Bishop and the Executive Board with the advice of the Deans of Convocation may divide the Diocese into such Convocations for the development and furtherance of missionary work as they may from time to time deem appropriate.

Section 7.2 (This section has been deleted)

Section 7.3 Appointment and Duties of Convocational Deans

A Dean shall be appointed to each Convocation by the Bishop for a term of two years and shall report annually to the Bishop. It shall be the duty of all Deans to call and arrange for such meetings of their Convocation as they deem expedient; to make provisions under the supervision of the Bishop for regular services, including the Holy Communion, for such Congregations in their Convocations as may be without a Head of Congregation; and to perform such other duties as are provided by Canon, or as may be assigned to them by the Bishop.

Section 7.4 (This section has been deleted)

Canon 8 PARISHES AND MISSIONS

Section 8.1 *Organization – Name*

A Parish, which has not been previously organized as a Mission, may be organized under any appropriate name by the adoption of Articles of Association and by duly choosing a Vestry and Wardens, at such time as it is capable of meeting all the financial obligations of a Parish, as well as its Quota and Assessment.

- (a) By not less than twenty-five confirmed communicants residing in any place in the Diocese, where there is not an organized Parish, and not less than ten of whom shall be at least 18 years of age.
- (b) Notice shall be given to the Bishop, but if there be no Bishop, then to the President of the Standing Committee, of the intention thus to associate and organize. Said notice shall be in writing and shall contain such information as will enable the Bishop to pass upon the propriety of the act, and such notice shall be signed by the persons proposing to organize a Parish.
- (c) The notice shall be substantially as follows:

assistance from the Diocese, or from any other Parish, and to this end we pledge ourselves to raise annually not less than the sum of _____ dollars for the salary of the Rector."

- (d) The Bishop, if the Bishop shall approve the notice, or in the Bishop's absence, the Standing Committee if they approve, shall give a certificate to that effect, which approval shall be transmitted to the Secretary of the Diocese with the papers upon which the certificate of approval was granted. Such approval shall be a condition precedent to the admission of the Parish into union with the Council of the Diocese.
- (e) As soon as the Bishop or Standing Committee, if there be a vacancy in the Episcopate, gives approval, the parties signing the notice of intention to organize shall meet and enter into Articles of Association as follows:

- Article 5. The annual rents, contributions, and other revenues raised by this congregation from time to time shall be applied by the Wardens and Vestry to the maintenance and support of the Rector or Minister and to such other objects as are connected with the well-being of the Church and to no other purposes whatever.
- Article 6. In the case of the dissolution of this congregation for any cause whatever, the lands, tenements, and other estates, real or personal, if such there be, shall vest in the Corporation known in law as the 'Protestant Episcopal Church Council of the Diocese of Texas,' to be held in trust by said corporation for the benefit of any future congregation of the Protestant Episcopal Church which may be formed in this place or its vicinity, upon the same principles as the present congregation."

(f) A certified copy of the Articles of Association shall be presented at the Annual Council next after said organization upon which the Council may act, giving or withholding its consent to the union of the said Parish with the Council as may seem best for the interests of the Church; and the Council may, if it be deemed expedient, define the boundaries of the Parish.

Section 8.2 Parochial Missions

Missions may be organized by any Parish, with the consent of the Bishop, by the Rector of the Parish or under the Rector's supervision, and such Mission shall be governed by such officers, and under such rules and regulations as may be satisfactory to the Rector of the Parish; but no such Mission shall be admitted into union with the Council, or be entitled to any allowance from the Executive Board of the Diocese without the consent of the Rector of the Parish and its Vestry.

Section 8.3 (This section has been deleted)

Section 8.4 Missions Petitioning to Become Parishes

Any Mission organized under the provisions of Canon 12 may petition the Council to be admitted as a Parish, at such time as it is capable of meeting all the financial obligations of a Parish, as well as its Assessments.

Section 8.5 Remitting Parishes to Missions

- (a) Whenever the Rector, Wardens, and Vestry, or if there be no Rector, the Wardens and Vestry of an existing Parish, shall unite in a petition to the Bishop, asking that such Parish shall be remitted to the position of an organized Mission, stating fully the grounds for such petition, the Bishop may, in the Bishop's discretion, grant or refuse said petition and the Bishop's action thereon shall be recorded with said petition in the minutes of the said Parish, and by the Bishop reported at the next Annual Council.
- (b) If the Wardens and Vestry of any Parish shall fail for a period of six months without just cause to elect a Rector, such Parish shall be considered dormant, and the Bishop, with the advice and consent of the Standing Committee, may remit such Parish to the position of an Organized Mission, and such action shall be reported by the Bishop to the next Annual Council.

Section 8.6 Suspending Parishes or Missions

- (a) Suspending Parishes or Missions from the right of representation in the Council of the Diocese shall be effected according to Article 6 of the Constitution. The suspension or dissolution of a Parish or Organized Mission must be in accordance with Article 6 of the Constitution.
- (b) Any Parish failing in three years out of the five years next preceding any Annual Council to elect a Vestry, to pay its assessments as assessed by the Council, to make the reports required by Canons, or to provide for the services of a Minister at least quarterly, shall lose voice and vote in the Council until the Council, by a two-thirds vote, after hearing

the recommendation of the Executive Board, shall otherwise determine; and upon a like failure for five consecutive years, shall be dropped from the roll of Parishes and remitted to the missionary field, unless the Council by a two-thirds vote, after hearing the recommendation of the Executive Board, shall otherwise determine. Any Parish failing for one year to comply with the terms of its organization may, at the discretion of the Bishop, be declared by the Bishop to cease to exist as a Parish and to thereby become a Mission of the Diocese, and such action by the Bishop shall be reported by the Bishop to the next Annual Council for record.

(c) Any Mission failing for two years to comply with the terms of its organization shall be suspended from union with the Council, subject to restoration by a two-thirds vote of the Council, and upon a like failure for three years it forfeits its organization.

Canon 11 PARISH REGISTER AND PAROCHIAL REPORTS

Section 11.1 Parish Register

- (a) In the Parish Register required by the Canons of the Episcopal Church to be kept in every Parish and Mission, there shall be recorded by the Head of Congregation of such Parish or Mission the name and date of birth of all persons baptized, with the names of the sponsors and parents; the names of all parties married and two or more witnesses present, and the place where the marriage was solemnized; the names of all persons buried, place of interment, and the date and time when each rite was performed.
- (b) The Register shall embrace a list of all communicants in the Parish or Mission as nearly as can be ascertained, a list of all families and adult persons within the Parish or Mission, and the names of persons confirmed, and dates of confirmation by the Bishop.
- (c) The Register shall be kept by the Head of Congregation and shall be preserved by the Vestry or Bishop's Committee, as the case may be, as a part of the Records of the Church, and in the absence of a Head of Congregation it shall be kept by the Senior Warden or Bishop's Warden and the Vestry or Bishop's Committee, as applicable.
- (d) Old Registers, filled up or no longer in current use, shall be deposited with the Archivist of the Diocese, who shall provide the Parish or Mission with a microfilm copy thereof; provided that, should the Parish or Mission desire to retain the old Registers, they shall be microfilmed and the film deposited with the Archivist. The same procedure shall be followed with the Minutes Books of the Vestry or Bishop's Committee and Registers of Services.

Section 11.2 Report to Diocesan Council

(a) Pursuant to the Canons of the General Convention, it is made the duty of every Head of Congregation of a Parish or Mission, or other proper officer, to prepare, upon the form adopted by the General Convention, a report for the year ending the thirty-first day of December preceding; and to file the same as instructed by General Convention no later than February first of the following year.

- (b) This report shall contain all information required in the form adopted by General Convention and such supplemental information as the Executive Board of the Diocese may require.
- (c) No Parish or Mission, or its Head of Congregation, shall be entitled to voice or vote in the Diocesan Council until the Secretary or the Bishop of the Diocese shall acknowledge filing of the completed Report to Diocesan Council required herein; provided that, with permission of the Bishop, Council may grant to the Parish or Mission, or its Head of Congregation, voice or vote, or both.

Section 11.3 Report of Occasional Services

Every active member of the Clergy not associated with any Parish or Mission shall report the member of the Clergy's occasional services; and if there have been none, the causes and reasons that have prevented the same.

Section 11.4 Reports Entered in Journal

These reports, or such parts of them as the Bishop may deem proper, shall be entered in the *Journal*.

Section 11.5 (This section has been deleted)

Canon 12 DIOCESAN MISSIONS

Section 12.1 Creation of Such Missions

Any ten or more baptized persons eighteen years or older, residing in any place where there is not any Parish or organized Mission, may make to the Bishop, or if there be no Bishop, to the Standing Committee of the Diocese, application in writing, signed by each of said persons, requesting the organization in such place of a Mission, to be conducted in conformity with the Doctrine, Discipline, and Worship of the Protestant Episcopal Church in the United States of America and the Constitution and Canons of said Church in this Diocese, and accepting responsibility for the payment of the annual assessment and any special assessments set by the Council. The organization of a new Mission within an existing Parish or Mission shall conform to Section 8.2 of Canon 8.

Section 12.2 Persons to Sign Application

This application shall be signed by all persons eighteen years of age or older who propose to be members of the Mission, and may be signed by any other persons who propose to be members of the Mission.

Section 12.3 Form of Application

The application shall be properly addressed to the Bishop, or if there be no Bishop, to the Standing Committee of the Diocese, and shall be substantially as follows:

We further agree to conform to the Constitution and Canons established for the government of the Diocese of Texas and to raise funds among us and faithfully pay to the Treasurer of the Diocese such obligation as may be assumed by us for the support of the missionary work in the Diocese."

Section 12.4 Organization, Appointments and Elections

- (a) Should the Bishop, or in the Bishop's absence, the Standing Committee, approve of such organization, the Bishop shall appoint a Bishop's Committee to include a Warden, a Clerk, and a Treasurer, who shall hold their offices until the first Monday in January, or until such day thereafter as shall be convenient for an election. The Treasurer need not be a member of the Bishop's Committee.
- (b) Annually on the first Monday in January, or as soon thereafter as convenient, there shall be held a congregational meeting and election for which public notice shall be given during the stated services the Sunday preceding. All members of the Mission shall be eligible to vote who are at least 16 years of age and are confirmed communicants in good standing.
- (c) Beginning with the first annual election, or in the event there is no Bishop's Committee, the Clerk and the Treasurer shall be elected by the members of the Mission; and the Warden shall be appointed, subject to the approval of the Bishop, by the Head of Congregation. The Head of Congregation shall have the right to appoint persons to such other positions as are desired. But if there be no Head of Congregation, the Warden shall be appointed by the Bishop; or, if the Bishop makes no appointment, the Warden shall be elected by the members of the Mission; and the other appointments shall rest with the Warden.
- (d) Upon approval of the Bishop, or in the Bishop's absence, the Standing Committee, any Mission at its annual election may elect up to fifteen persons to the Bishop's Committee, the number to be determined by Congregational meeting; provided that the terms of office of the Committee members shall be such that one-third of the members shall be elected annually after the first election. After such an election the Warden shall be appointed from those in the Committee, subject to the approval of the Bishop, by the Head of Congregation; and the remaining officers shall be elected by the members of the Mission

from those in the Committee, or by the Committee from its own membership, as the members of the Mission may direct by vote at the meeting.

- (e) No person shall serve as a member of the Bishop's Committee until that person shall have subscribed to the declaration required of members of a Vestry in Canon 9.1(b).
- (f) When the Mission petitions to become a Parish,
 - (1) the members of the Bishop's Committee elected in accordance with Section 12.4(d) above, shall continue to serve until their respective terms expire;
 - (2) it shall comply with the requirements set out in Canon 8 above.
- (g) At the annual election the members of the Mission shall elect also one delegate and one alternate delegate to the Council of the Diocese as provided in the Constitution (Section 2.2, 2.3, and 2.5), unless, as provided therein, the members of the Mission direct the Bishop's Committee to make suitable choice. However, the delegate and alternate may be elected at a special congregational meeting called for the purpose, if the Bishop's Committee determines that election at the annual meeting will not allow adequate time to prepare for participation in the Council. Public notice of any special meeting must be given during the stated services the Sunday preceding.
- (h) Except at the time of the Bishop's initial appointment of officers, the members of the Bishop's Committee shall be at least 18 years and confirmed communicants of the Church in good standing.

Section 12.5 Council to Approve Application

At the first Annual Council of the Diocese following the organization of the Mission, the application as prescribed in Section 12.1, 12.2, and 12.3, shall be submitted to the Council, together with the certificate of approval by the Bishop, or if there be no Bishop, by the Standing Committee. And the Council may act, giving or withholding its consent to the union of the said Mission with the Council as may seem best for the interests of the Church.

Section 12.6 The Bishop's Committee

- (a) At all meetings of the congregation or of the Bishop's Committee, the Head of Congregation, the Warden, the Clerk, or the Treasurer, taking precedence in the order named, shall have the right to preside.
- (b) A majority of the Committee members, the whole having been duly cited to meet, shall constitute a quorum; and a majority of the quorum so convened shall be competent to act. If a quorum should repeatedly fail to meet, having been duly cited, so that the affairs of the Church go unattended, the Head of Congregation, as chair, may declare a representative group of the Committee members competent to act.
- (c) The Bishop's Committee shall establish rules for and keep a record of its proceedings. It shall meet as required by its own rules, or whenever called by the Bishop, the Head of Congregation, or a majority of its members. It shall be the duty of the Bishop's Committee

to administer the temporal concerns of the Church, to collect necessary moneys, to provide for prompt payment of all liabilities incurred and assessments levied by Diocesan Council, to attend to all matters pertaining to Church properties and their maintenance, to provide the Head of Congregation a discretionary fund as required by General Canon, to contribute to the Head of Congregation's salary, to take part in special offerings such as that requested for Theological Education and for other purposes, and, in general, to assist the Head of Congregation in carrying on the work of the Church.

(d) By two-thirds vote of the whole membership, approved by the Head of Congregation of the Mission and the Bishop, the Bishop's Committee may remove any member of the Bishop's Committee whose conduct may tend to bring reproach on the Church.

Section 12.7 Duties of Warden

- (a) It shall be the duty of the Warden to secure some room or house to be used as a place of worship, and with the advice of the Head of Congregation to provide all things necessary for conducting the service decently and in order, and to make provision for the bread and wine of the Holy Communion. The Warden shall have a care that the offerings are collected at each service and paid over to the Treasurer of the Mission. It shall also be the Warden's duty to supervise the Bishop's Committee in collecting and forwarding to the proper officers all assessments levied by the Council. With the assistance of the Bishop's Committee, the Warden shall in general carry out the functions of a parish Warden as specified in Canon 10.
- (b) In the absence of a resident Head of Congregation, the Warden shall take care of the altarware, also of any linen, service books, or other property belonging to the Mission; and it shall be the Warden's duty, if possible, to provide continuing services of worship. It also shall be the Warden's duty, in the absence of a Head of Congregation to make for the Mission such reports as the Bishop, Council, or the diocesan officers may from time to time require.

Section 12.8 Duties of Clerk

It shall be the duty of the Clerk to keep a record of events of importance to the Mission, and a list of the members of the Mission. In the absence of a Head of Congregation the Clerk shall have custody of the Parish Register and of the Register of Services, but the entries therein must be made under the direction of the Head of Congregation, or if none, of the Warden.

Section 12.9 Duties of Treasurer

It shall be the duty of the Treasurer of the Mission to receive all moneys contributed to the Church through the Mission, to make whatever disbursements are required by Canon or the Council, or authorized by the Bishop's Committee. Specifically the Treasurer shall conduct the affairs of the Treasurer's office in accordance with the provisions of Canon 8.6(b) and Canons 13, 14, 18, and 19. The Treasurer shall keep account of all monetary transactions, and provide the diocesan officers, the Head of Congregation, and the Bishop's Committee, such reports as they may from time to time require. The Treasurer shall reimburse the Head of Congregation and the Warden for actual expenses necessarily incurred in the performance of the duties required of them by Canons or directed by the Bishop's Committee. The receipt of

the Head of Congregation or the Warden shall be a proper voucher, such receipt stating the item of expense.

Section 12.10 Dissolution

The failure of the Mission to fulfill the stipulations may warrant the Executive Board of the Diocese, with the consent of the Bishop, in withdrawing the Head of Congregation and dissolving the Mission.

Section 12.11 (This section has been deleted)

Section 12.12 Episcopal Fellowships

In any place where there is not a Parish or organized Mission, and where the establishment of a Mission does not appear feasible, an Episcopal Fellowship may be established by the Bishop, or in the absence of the Bishop, by the Standing Committee, upon such terms, conditions, and limitations and with such provision for its maintenance as the Bishop or the Standing Committee, as applicable, shall prescribe. The Bishop shall report to each annual Council the number of Episcopal Fellowships existing, their location, the means provided for their maintenance, and the terms, conditions, and limitations of their existence. Upon recommendation of the Bishop and with approval of the Council, each Episcopal Fellowship shall be entitled to one Lay Delegate to any meeting of Council and may be seated with voice, but without vote.

Section 12.13 Special Evangelical Missions

At the request of one or more sponsoring parishes, the Bishop, or in the absence of the Bishop, the Standing Committee may establish a Special Evangelical Mission upon such terms, conditions, and limitations, and with such provisions for its maintenance as the Bishop or the Standing Committee, as applicable, shall prescribe. The Bishop shall report to each annual Council the number of Special Evangelical Missions existing, their location and sponsors, the nature of their ministries and the needs being met, the means provided for their maintenance, and the terms, conditions, and limitations of their existence.

Canon 13 FINANCE

Section 13.1 Fiscal Year of Diocese and Parishes

The fiscal year of this Diocese and each Parish and Mission thereof shall begin January 1st.

Section 13.2 Communicants to Contribute

The Bishop, as the chief Pastor, has a claim upon each baptized member of the Church, and especially upon the communicants, for the Bishop's support; and each communicant shall contribute annually towards the payment of such sum as the Council may assess for that purpose, the payment of which assessment is enjoined as a sacred duty.

Section 13.3 Annual Budget – Assessments

Each Annual Council shall arrange and adopt a budget for the year for the necessary and proper expenses of the Diocese as prescribed in the Constitution; the Executive Board of the Diocese shall distribute and assess equitably against each Parish and Mission in union with the Council the amount of the budget so adopted as its proportionate share of the financial obligations of the Diocese for the year; and such assessments shall become a charge against the Parish or Mission so assessed from the time it is approved and ordered by the Council, and shall be payable monthly. Each Parish or Mission may take such steps as may seem best for providing and paying to the Treasurer of the Diocese the amount so assessed, or may pay the same from the general fund of the Parish or Mission.

Section 13.4 Arrears in Assessments

No Parish or Mission in arrears for any of the assessments for the support of the Diocese shall be entitled to representation in the Diocesan Council until all past due assessments have been paid or have been forgiven by the Council. Arrears in premiums due to the Church Pension Fund are governed by Canon 18.7 and Council may not forgive any arrears for the Church Pension Fund.

Section 13.5 Annual Audits

The accounts of all Parishes, Missions, and other Church institutions and organizations in the Diocese relating to the receipts and expenditures or investments of money shall be audited annually at the end of each calendar year by an independent Certified Public Accountant, independent Licensed Public Accountant, or such audit committee as shall be authorized by the Executive Board. The reports of all such audits, including any memoranda issued by the auditing authority regarding internal controls or other accounting matters, shall be filed with the Bishop not later than thirty (30) days following the date of such reports but in any event prior to September 1 of each year covering the financial reports of the previous calendar year.

Canon 14 OFFERINGS

Section 14.1 Bishop's Purse

Offerings taken on the occasion of a visit of the Bishop, Bishop Coadjutor, or a Bishop Suffragan shall be for the purse of the Bishop making such visitation. Each Bishop shall have the right to disburse such offerings, and funds otherwise acquired, in furtherance of the Bishop's activities and the work of the Church in this Diocese. Such offerings shall be sent to the Discretionary Fund of the Bishop making the visit.

Section 14.2 Whitsunday Offering

On Whitsunday, or the first Sunday service thereafter, an offering shall be made in each Parish or Mission for the Episcopal Endowment Fund. The Trustees of this Fund, in their Annual Report, shall publish the names of the Parishes and/or Missions that have remitted to the Fund in the past year.

Canon 15 (This canon has been deleted)

Canon 16 THE EPISCOPAL ENDOWMENT FUND

Section 16.1 Administration of Fund

The Episcopal Endowment Fund shall be held and controlled by the Trustees of the Corporation known as the Protestant Episcopal Church Council of the Diocese of Texas as provided in Section 8.1 of Article 8 of the Constitution, under the following rules and regulations:

- (a) (this subsection has been deleted)
- (b) It shall be the duty of all persons who shall receive any moneys or property of any character from any source for the endowment of the Episcopate to immediately deliver it to said Trustees of the Protestant Episcopal Church Council of the Dioceses of Texas.
- (c) It shall be the duty of the Trustees to convert all properties received by them for the use of said fund, whether said properties be received by gift, devise, or by purchase; and to invest without delay all money received in well-secured loans and in first-class securities, as may be deemed the most advantageous to said fund.
- (d) The net annual income arising from the investments of this fund, after paying the necessary expenses incident to the management thereof, or so much thereof as shall be necessary, shall be applied to the payment of the salary of the Bishop of this Diocese; and the remainder of said net income, if any there be, shall be applied to increasing the capital of said fund. Any profits derived from the sale of securities may be used in the support of the Bishop and Bishop Coadjutor, if there be one, as the Trustees may determine.
- (e) In the management of said fund, said Trustees are authorized to sign all checks, receipts, releases, acquittances, and such other instruments as may be necessary to the legal and economical administration of said fund.
- (f) The Trustees shall make as a separate report to each Annual Council, a complete statement of the administration of said fund showing all moneys or property received since the last annual report; also all loans outstanding, to whom made, the character of security, rate of interest, and moneys and properties on hand at the time of said report, and where deposited or situated, and such other information as will disclose the true status of said fund.
- (g) The Trustees shall pay to the Treasurer of the Diocese all amounts received as interest on the outstanding investments, the same to be used in the payment of the salary of the Bishop of the Diocese, as aforesaid; provided, the amount so paid to the Treasurer of the Diocese shall not exceed the salary of the Bishop, and if there be an excess, the same shall be invested as part of the capital fund.

Canon 17 THE BISHOP QUIN FOUNDATION

Section 17.1 Creation of Fund

In commemoration of the Twenty-fifth Anniversary of the consecration of the Rt. Rev. Clinton S. Quin as Bishop in the Diocese of Texas, all contributions made on the occasion of such Anniversary are hereby set aside and appropriated for the purpose of creating a fund which shall be known as The Bishop Quin Foundation.

Section 17.2 Revolving and Permanent Funds

The sum of \$9,000.00 of the funds originally contributed, together with Twenty-five Per Cent of all contributions subsequently made, shall be placed in the revolving fund. The balance of the funds originally contributed, together with Seventy-five Per Cent of all subsequent contributions, shall be placed in the permanent fund. However, any donor may specify the fund or funds in which his or her contribution shall be placed.

Section 17.3 (This section has been deleted)

Section 17.4 Use of Funds

The corpus of the permanent fund shall not be expended. All or any part of income therefrom may, from time to time, be placed in the revolving fund, if so determined by the Board of Trustees of the Foundation.

The revolving fund may be loaned or advanced for any purposes which the Bishop and said Board of Trustees may determine to be in furtherance of the spiritual and physical welfare of the Diocese particularly in accordance with the current Mission of The Bishop Quin Foundation which is to help build the Church.

Section 17.5 Board of Trustees

The Board of Trustees of The Bishop Quin Foundation shall consist of the Bishop, who shall be an ex-officio member and chair of the Board, and shall further consist, at all times, of nine or more other members, the number of whom shall be a multiple of three, at least three of whom shall be members of the Clergy, and at least six of whom shall be lay persons, who are at least 18 years of age and are confirmed communicants in good standing in some Parish or Mission in the Diocese. One-third of the original Board shall be elected for a one-year term, one-third for a two-year term, and one-third for a three-year term. Members of the Board of Trustees shall be elected by the Council of the Diocese of Texas on nomination of the Diocesan. The Treasurer of the Diocese shall be an ex-officio member of the Board. The Bishop Coadjutor, if there be one, or a Bishop Suffragan, may be assigned by the Bishop as an ex-officio member of the Board. At each succeeding Annual Council one-third of the regular members of the Board of Trustees shall be elected for a three-year term. Members elected at the 1956 Council, and thereafter, who serve six consecutive years, may not be elected to succeed themselves until after one year has elapsed. The Board shall be charged with the duty of raising additional funds for the purpose of increasing the assets of The Bishop Quin Foundation and enlarging its activities and the scope of its work.

Section 17.6 Incorporation – Officers – Executive Committee

The Board of Trustees is hereby authorized to organize a nonprofit corporation in furtherance of its religious, charitable, and educational activities, the same to be known as "The Bishop Quin Foundation." The Board of Trustees shall serve as Trustees of the Corporation and shall be elected as now or as may hereafter be provided by the Constitution and Canons of the Protestant Episcopal Church in the Diocese of Texas. The Trustees shall elect a President, Vice President, Secretary, Treasurer, and any such officers the Board may deem necessary, all of whom shall be charged with such duties and responsibilities as provided by law, and as may from time to time be provided in by-laws, which the Trustees are authorized to adopt, consistent with said Constitution and Canons. The Secretary and Treasurer need not be a member of the Board of Trustees. The by-laws may authorize an Executive Committee with such powers as may be provided in the by-laws and by the Board of Trustees.

Section 17.7 Administration of Funds

The Board of Trustees shall have full charge of the administration, investment, reinvestment, and disbursement of both permanent and revolving funds.

Section 17.8 Annual Reports

The Board of Trustees shall make an annual report of its activities to each Council, including a report of all receipts and disbursements of the funds of the Foundation. If and when required by the Executive Board of the Diocese, the Board of Trustees shall make such additional reports and furnish such additional information to the Executive Board as may be required.

Canon 21 PROPERTY

Section 21.1 *Title to Property*

The title to all real estate and other property acquired for the use of the Church in this Diocese, as well as to property conveyed to institutions of a Diocesan character or for their use, shall be vested as provided in Article 9 of the Constitution.

Section 21.2 Sale, Lease, or Other Disposition

If the particular use for which such property has been conveyed or the purpose of the trust fails and it becomes necessary to sell or lease the property, or otherwise dispose of it, the Church Corporation known as the Protestant Episcopal Church Council of the Diocese of Texas, with the consent of the Bishop or the Standing Committee or a majority of the members of that body, if there be no Bishop, is hereby authorized to execute such legal instruments as may be necessary to convey, lease, or effect such other disposition as is herein authorized.

Section 21.3 Right to Sell, Convey, or Encumber

No Rector, Wardens, or Vestry shall, by deed or otherwise, without the written consent of the Bishop or the Standing Committee or a majority of the members of that body, if there be no Bishop, alienate, convey, or in any manner dispose of any lands or real property, title to which is in them vested as aforesaid, nor charge or in any manner encumber the same for any purpose whatever. No conveyance or encumbrance of real property shall be valid unless joined in or approved by the Church Corporation.

Canon 31 PROTESTANT EPISCOPAL CHURCH COUNCIL OF THE DIOCESE OF TEXAS

Section 31.1 An Instrumentality of the Diocese

Protestant Episcopal Church Council of the Diocese of Texas, a nonprofit, benevolent, and charitable corporation, organized under Texas laws, also known as The Church Corporation, is authorized under its charter powers, in addition to its regular corporate powers, to receive, hold, manage, and administer funds and properties acquired by gift or by will or otherwise, for the use and benefit of the Diocese and any Diocesan institution, and may also act as trustee in receiving, holding, managing, and administering funds for the use and benefit of any Parish or Mission in the Diocese.

Section 31.2 Trustees and Powers

The management of its affairs shall be conducted and administered by a Board of Trustees of five elected members, all of whom shall either be lay persons, at least 18 years of age who are confirmed communicants in good standing of some Parish or Mission in the Diocese, or members of the Clergy canonically resident in the Diocese of Texas, in addition to the Bishop of the Diocese, who shall serve as Chair of the Board or who may designate the President or other officer of the corporation to serve as such. The Board of Trustees shall have the power and authority to conduct the affairs of said corporation in accordance with its charter and by- laws and in accordance with the Constitution and Canons of the Diocese from time to time adopted. If the office of Bishop is vacant, the Standing Committee shall promptly designate one of its members to serve as a member of the Board of Trustees until a Bishop is elected and qualified, and, until a Bishop is elected and qualified, such member, in consultation with the Standing Committee, may exercise the power expressly granted to the Bishop in this Canon.

Section 31.3 Elections – Vacancies

One member of the Board of Trustees shall be elected at each Annual Council and each member shall serve for a term of five years. The term of each member shall be so arranged that the term of only one member shall expire annually. The Board of Trustees may fill any vacancies that occur on the Board until the next Annual Council, when any vacancy shall be filled by election for the remainder of the unexpired term.

Section 31.4 Officers and By-Laws

The Board of Trustees shall have power to adopt its own by-laws and to alter, amend, or repeal the by-laws or to adopt new by-laws. The Board of Trustees shall elect such officers as its by-laws may require from time to time.

Section 31.5 Title to Properties - Conveyances - Encumbrances

Title to the properties now owned and hereafter acquired by the Protestant Episcopal Church Council of the Diocese of Texas for its use and benefit and for the use and benefit of Parishes, Missions, and other Diocesan Organizations, shall be held in the name of said corporation and may only be conveyed or encumbered with the approval of the Board of Trustees and in accordance with the Constitution and Canons of the Diocese of Texas. All of the assets and properties of the Corporation and accumulations thereof shall be held and administered to effectuate its purposes. In case of liquidation, dissolution, or winding up of the Corporation, whether voluntary or involuntary, or by operation of law, the assets or properties of the Corporation shall be distributed in such manner as the Board of Trustees of the Corporation shall direct; provided, however,that any such distribution shall be exclusively to carry out the purposes for which the Corporation is formed, or for one or more other exempt purposes within the meaning of the applicable provisions of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954, as amended, or any similar federal statute then in effect, and rules and regulations pursuant thereto.

Section 31.6 Reports and Records

The Board of Trustees shall submit a report at each Annual Council covering its operation for the preceding fiscal year and showing its financial condition. If and when required by the Executive Board of the Diocese, the Board of Trustees shall make such additional reports and furnish such additional information as may be requested. The books and records of the Board of Trustees shall at all times be open for inspection and examination by the Executive Board of the Diocese or its representatives.

Canon 32 (This canon has been deleted)

Canon 33 EPISCOPAL FOUNDATION OF TEXAS

Section 33.1 An Instrumentality of the Diocese

The Episcopal Foundation of Texas, a nonprofit corporation organized and existing by virtue of the laws of the State of Texas (the Foundation), is hereby designated as an instrumentality of the Diocese to hold and administer, subject to Article 9 of the Constitution, and Canon 21, the following:

(1) All assets, properties, and distributions heretofore or hereafter received by the Diocese from the Estate of H. H. Coffield, Deceased, except dispositions, if any, heretofore made by

the Church Corporation, shall be set aside and appropriated for the purpose of creating a fund which shall be known as the Coffield Fund. The corpus of the Coffield Fund shall be placed in a permanent fund and shall not be expended; provided, if so determined by the Board of Trustees of the Foundation, with consent of the Bishop, portions of the corpus of the Coffield Fund may, from time to time and at any time, be (a) loaned to The Bishop Quin Foundation, and (b) given, granted, loaned, or advanced for the purpose of establishing one or more memorials to the memory of H. H. Coffield, Deceased. Subject only to the requirements of the Foundation, all of the income from the Coffield Fund shall, from time to time, be placed in a revolving fund. Portions of the revolving fund may be given, granted, loaned, or advanced to (a) The Bishop Quin Foundation, (b) Camp Allen, (c) Diocesan Saint James Houses, (d) St. Stephen's Episcopal School, (e) the Episcopal Theological Seminary of the Southwest, (f) the University of the South, (g) St. Vincent's House, and (h) El Buen Samaritano Episcopal Mission. Subject to the foregoing, with consent of the Bishop, the Foundation shall give ten percent (10%) of the amount from time to time placed in the revolving fund for other general purposes of the Diocese, excluding the Budget of the Diocese, which purpose may include gifts, grants, loans, and advances to-Episcopal Relief and Development and other charitable trusts, nonprofit corporations, and national organizations affiliated with the Protestant Episcopal Church in the United States of America, all as may from time to time and at any time hereafter be designated by the Trustees of the Foundation, with consent of the Bishop.

(2) All assets, properties, and distributions heretofore or hereafter received by the Foundation, other than those received by the Diocese from the Estate of H. H. Coffield, Deceased, shall be set aside and appropriated for the purpose of creating one or more fund(s), as determined by the Trustees of the Foundation. The purpose of such fund(s) shall be, (a) to render financial assistance to worthy and capable men and women in the Diocese of Texas desirous of entering the ordained ministry of the Protestant Episcopal Church in the United States of America (the Episcopal Church); (b) to render financial assistance to the worthy and capable men and women in the Diocese of Texas who are presently engaged in, or who desire to prepare for, religious work in the Episcopal Church; (c) to render supplementary financial aid to the members of the Episcopal clergy of the Diocese of Texas; (d) to render financial assistance to such activities, projects, agencies, and instrumentalities of the Episcopal Church in the Diocese of Texas for which adequate financial provision has not been made; and (e) to foster, develop, and contribute generally to the support of the religious, educational, and charitable work of the Episcopal Church in the Diocese of Texas by making gifts, grants, loans, and advances solely and exclusively for religious, educational, and charitable purposes to any organization, institution, agency, or other body of, or in any way associated, affiliated, or connected with, the Episcopal Church in the Diocese of Texas.

Section 33.2 Trustees – Powers and Duties

The management of the affairs of the Foundation shall be conducted by a Board of Trustees consisting of not less than four nor more than sixteen elected members, all of whom are confirmed communicants in good standing, at least 18 years of age, of some Parish or Mission in the Diocese of Texas, in addition to the Bishop and Bishop Coadjutor, if there be one, and any Suffragan Bishop assigned to the Board by the Bishop, who shall be *ex-officio* members. The Board of Trustees shall have the power and authority to manage, operate, and conduct the affairs of the Foundation on its own financial responsibility in accordance with the

legal instrument creating the same, the Constitution and Canons of the Diocese of Texas, and the by-laws to be adopted by the Board.

Section 33.3 Selection of Board – Elections – Vacancies

One-fourth of the elected members of the Board of Trustees shall be elected at each Annual Council, and each member shall serve for a term of four years. All elections shall be upon nomination by the Bishop. The Board of Trustees, with the consent of the Bishop, may fill any vacancies that occur on the Board until the next Annual Council, when any vacancy shall be filled by election for the remainder of the unexpired term. Retiring members of the Board who have served full four-year terms shall not be eligible for renomination until a period of one year shall have elapsed.

Section 33.4 Properties

The Foundation shall have authority to receive properties and funds by gift, devise, or otherwise, and to hold, manage, operate, invest, and re-invest the same under, pursuant to, and in accordance with the provisions of this Canon, the by-laws adopted by the Board, and the Trust instrument or corporate charter creating the same. All of the property and funds of the Foundation and the accumulation thereof shall be held and administered to effectuate this purpose. In case of the liquidation, dissolution, or winding up of the Foundation, whether voluntary, involuntary, or by operation of law, the assets and properties of the Foundation shall be distributed in such manner as the Board of Trustees shall direct; provided, however, that any such distribution shall be such as is calculated to carry out exclusively the purposes for which the Foundation is formed, or for one or more other exempt purposes within the meaning of the applicable provisions of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954, as amended, or any similar Federal statute then in effect, and the rules and regulations pursuant thereto.

Section 33.5 By-Laws and Officers

The Board of Trustees shall adopt its own by-laws and elect such officers as the by-laws may provide. Officers shall be elected by and from the Board of Trustees at the first meeting of the Board next following the holding of each Annual Council and shall hold office for one year and until their successors are elected and qualified.

Section 33.6 Reports and Records

The Board of Trustees shall file a written report at each Annual Council covering its operations for the preceding fiscal year and showing its financial condition. If and when required by the Executive Board of the Diocese, the Board of Trustees shall make such additional reports and furnish such additional information as may be requested. A complete record shall be made of all funds and moneys received and disbursed in the operation of the Foundation, and the funds and moneys so received and disbursed shall be used solely in furtherance of the aims and purposes of the Foundation.

Canon 37 (This canon has been deleted)

Canon 38 SCHOOLS

Section 38.1 Relationship to the Diocese

All schools or other educational facilities providing secular education for young people equivalent to that provided by nursery schools or on the kindergarten, grade school, grammar school, or high school level, and located on any premises used for the benefit of or operated under the control, auspices, or approval of any Parish, Mission, organization, or institution of the Diocese, or any combination or group thereof, shall be an Episcopal School of the Diocese, and no such school shall be established, maintained, or operated without the written approval and consent of the Bishop of the Diocese of Texas. The Principal, Headmaster, or Headmistress of an Episcopal School of the Diocese shall be a confirmed communicant in good standing of a Parish or Mission of the Diocese. The Bishop may make exception of the requirement set forth in the preceding sentence, within such limitations and conditions as the Bishop may prescribe. The Head of Congregation (or if there be none, the Senior Warden) of the sponsoring Parish or Mission shall be a member ex-officio and Chair of the governing board of the school; provided that, in the absence of or at the pleasure of the Head of Congregation, a designee of the Head of Congregation may serve from time to time as Chair.

Section 38.2 Standards of Compliance

- (a) The Bishop shall establish a Diocesan Commission on Schools consisting of no less than 5 nor more than 12 communicants in good standing in the Diocese. It shall be the duty of the Commission to publish (subject to the Bishop's approval) Standards for Episcopal Schools in this Diocese, give general supervision to all such schools, and perform such other functions regarding such schools as the Bishop may require. All schools shall comply with such Standards as well as the other provisions of this Canon.
- (b) Each school shall comply with health, safety, fire, and sanitation standards at least equal to those required at any time by state, county, and municipal health, safety, fire, and sanitation codes for the locality in which such school is located, and the Bishop or the Bishop's representative shall inspect, or cause to be inspected, at least annually, all schools in order to ascertain compliance with such codes and standards. In addition, each school shall maintain standards in all respects that will enable the Diocese to certify to all governmental authorities that such school is entitled to the benefit of exemption from all licensing provisions imposed by such governmental authority.

Section 38.3 Failure of Compliance

Any such school that fails to comply with the provisions of this Canon shall not be entitled to be located on any property that is used for the benefit of any Parish, Mission, institution, or organization of the Diocese of Texas; and neither shall it be entitled to be operated under the control, auspices, or approval of any such Parish, Mission, institution, or organization of the Diocese of Texas.

Section 38.4 Reports and Inspections

The Bishop shall have the right at any time, and from time to time, to require and obtain such information and reports as may be deemed necessary by the Bishop to ensure compliance with this Canon, and the Bishop shall likewise have the right at any time, and from time to time, to inspect or cause to be inspected, each such school in order to monitor compliance with the provisions of this Canon. The Bishop shall have the right at any time to appoint one or more representatives to assist the Bishop in ensuring compliance with the Canon.

Canon 39 GENERAL FUNDS APPEALS

Section 39.1 Definition

- (a) For the purpose of this Canon the term "General Funds Appeal" shall mean any solicitation of funds made by or for the Diocese or any institution thereof among the Parishes and Missions of the Diocese for any Diocesan purpose which requires the action and support of the Vestry or Bishop's Committee of the Parish or Mission in which the appeal is made.
- (b) The term "General Funds Appeal" shall not mean any solicitation of funds by any Parish or Mission of its own volition among its own members for any purpose.
- (c) The term "General Funds Appeal" shall not mean any solicitation of funds made among all the Parishes and Missions of the Diocese in support of any program of the National Church.

Section 39.2 (This section has been deleted)

Section 39.3 Requirements

- (a) No General Funds Appeal shall be made among the Parishes and Missions of the Diocese until the proposal therefor has been presented at least thirty (30) days prior to the convening of the annual council to the Bishop and the Executive Board for their consideration and recommendation.
- (b) It shall be the duty of the Bishop and the Executive Board to report to the next meeting of the Council following the submission to it of any proposed General Funds Appeal.
- (c) No General Funds Appeal shall be made among the Parishes and Missions of the Diocese unless authorized by the Council after hearing the reports of the Bishop and the Executive Board.

- 1) The Church Corp. granted \$45,000 to the Diocese to assist with the Bishops' travel costs to Taiwar for the House of Bishops in the fall of 2014. The Church Corp. also granted the Diocese \$40,000 to bring in experts to conduct evangelism mini-conferences in 2014 and 2015.
- 2) The budget was created with the intention that the Diocese would manage the payroll for the chaplains at St. Luke's Hospital for quarterly fee. CHI decided to take the payroll processing of the chaplains back in-house beginning on April 1, 2014
- 3) Revenues that are in excess of budget but are offset by increased expenses reported elsewhere
- 4) Overage in budgeted revenue is mainly due to FIND/Spiritual Formation registration fees
- 5) Restricted donations totaling \$10,000 were collected for St. Vincent's House during the 165th Council Offering, those funds were remitted to St. Vincent's in February 2014 and are recognized as part of Council expense in these financial statements Also, a sabbatical grant of \$7,500 was received from Bishop Quin to assist with the costs of Bishop Doyle's summer/fall sabbatical In addition, the Emmett Estate bequeathed \$50,000 to the Diocese for use on "impoverished persons" and the Diocese receiver \$9,600 from the G. Montgomery Mitchell Estate.
- 6) Expenses were higher as a result of greater coaching needs in our congregations due to clergy transitions
- 7) The variance in these accounts are due to a change of housing allowance elections after the budget was created. The variance nets to near zero.
- 8) Assisting Bishops were not used as much as had been anticipated during Bishop Doyle's sabbatical
- 9) Expenses for the Secretary were less than had been projected due to changes in the planned staffing for that office
- 10) The lay staff of the Office of the Bishop is in excess of budget due to hiring in the Safeguarding department, and one additional stal person added to Bishop's Office upon retirement. A Compass Rose employee's expenses are also shown here and are offset by the Compass Rose funds received in revenue.
- 11) Bishop Doyle's business and travel expenses include some costs associated with his summer/fall sabbatical, some of which wi be offset by donations. See also note 1 above.
- 12) Travel by Canon Ryan has been less than anticipated due to Bishop Doyle's sabbatical

- 13) Safe church expenses include costs associated with assisting smaller churches with the SRS Records Archive Project
 Such costs include staff time and travel expenses in addition to IT expenses for monthly maintenance of the new SRS database
- 14) The Hispanic Lay Ministry Conference expense of approximately \$13,000, held at Camp Allen, was recognized on the books of the Diocese, instead of Camp Allen starting in 2014.
- 15) The Business Manager's position was not filled although it was provided in the budget
- 16) The Provincial Synod meets in 2015 not 2014.
- 17) Calling & Moving includes unexpected costs associated with assisting clergy to move out of the Diocese as well as costs incurred in relation to a bishop's residence.
- 18) The Diocese did not find a suitable candidate to lead new missions that had been anticipated in 2014
- 19) Clergy and staff headcount was higher than had been budgeted for 2014 resulting in higher than budgeted health insurance premiums
- 20) The Seafarer's Center previously raised these funds and they are now being granted to the Great Commission Fund to support that outreach ministry in the GCF budget. They were on hand at 12/31/13 and to show their movement have been accrued as a grant.
- S Special revenue and expense accounts are shown as net on the Diocesan financial statements because they are not part of the normal Diocesan operations and are thus not included in the budget. They represent the Bastrop fir relief program, which was a temporary program managed by the Diocesan Disaster Relief department that ended in 2014. Excess revenue from 2013 in the amount of \$18,000 were applied to the expense overage in the current year and is included in the "Net Assets Special Accounts" amount on the Balance Sheet

In addition, Special accounts include revenues and expenses related to the new Bayou City Service Corp project. Revenues include grant funds from the Bishop Quin Foundation and from the 6 "host sites" that are receiving the benefit of the 6 interns' voluntee employment. Expenses for the program consist of room and board for the six interns, as well as a monthly grocery budget and a minimal monthly stipend.

Special accounts also include revenue and expenses related to the Daring Way event to be held in February 2015 at Camp Aller Certain contractually obligated expenses and grant revenue are recognized in 2014, with the remaining revenue and expense to be recognized in 2015.



GIFTS AND BEQUESTS

The Church Corporation is authorized, under its charter powers as a Texas Corporation, in addition to its regular corporate powers, to receive, hold, manage, and administer funds and properties acquired by gift, will or otherwise, for the use and benefit of the Diocese and any Diocesan institutions, and may also act as trustee in receiving, holding, managing, and administering funds for the use and benefit of any Parish or Mission in the Diocese. The name of the corporation is PROTESTANT EPISCOPAL CHURCH COUNCIL OF THE DIOCESE OF TEXAS.

Bequests made to the Church Corporation, whether unrestricted or limited to some specific purpose within the Diocese, are deductible in computing federal estate and Texas inheritance taxes. In addition, contributions of such nature made during a donor's lifetime are deductible for federal income tax purposes.
